Reports directly to the Head Coach, Football on a daily basis and is ultimately responsible to the Senior Athletics Director.

- Minimum coaching certification: NCCP Level II.
- Coaching experience, preferably at the University or National level, or equivalent.
- Excellent leadership skills and ability to recruit.
- Ability to communicate effectively and efficiently.
- Strong organizational, administrative and computer skills an asset.
- A proven record of integrity, high principles, and a demonstrated skill in developing/motivating student-athletes both academically and athletically.
- A pleasant personality together with a positive attitude is essential.

- Knowledge of the academic system at the University.
- Strong interpersonal and communication skills and the ability to work effectively with a wide range of constituencies in a diverse community, including the Football community.
