We want all fans attending U SPORTS events to enjoy the experience in a responsible fashion. When attending a game, spectators are required to refrain from the following behaviours:

- Behaviour that is unruly, disruptive or illegal in nature;
- Throwing objects on the field of play;
- Unauthorized persons accessing the the field of play;
- Intoxication or other signs of alcohol impairment that results in irresponsible behaviour;
- Foul and/or abusive language and/or obscene gestures;
- Verbal or physical harassment of opposing team fans, officials, opponents or other person;
- Intentionally sitting or standing in areas which obstruct the passage and/or view of other spectators;
- Failing to following instructions of university or security staff.

Event patrons are responsible for their conduct as well as the conduct of their guests. University or security staff will promptly intervene to support an environment where event patrons, their guests and other fans can enjoy the event free from the above behaviour. Event patrons and guests who violate these provisions will be subject to ejection without refund and loss of ticket privileges for future games.

Honourary Chair Steve Konchalski

he winningest men's basketball coach in Canadian university sport history, Steve Konchalski (better known as 'Coach K') retired in March, 2021 after serving as men's basketball head coach for 46 seasons at STFX University.

Coach K won three national championships and nine AUS conference championships at the helm of the X-Men. The 2001 U SPORTS Coach of the Year was also honoured on six occasions as AUS Coach of the Year, leading the X-Men to 18 U SPORTS championship appearances and 42 AUS playoff appearances. Coach K finished with 919 career wins with .614 win percentage.



Konchalski served as head coach of Team Canada for four years (1995-98) and was an assistant coach for 16 years prior. Coaching in three Olympic Games, Steve has been a member of Canada Basketball's Counsel of Excellence since 2009. He was a member of coaching staff of the Canadian U19 team that won the 2017 World Championship.

Coach K has been inducted into four Sports Hall of Fame: Acadia, STFX, Nova Scotia & Canadian Basketball. Upon renovation in 2017, the court in the STFX Saputo Centre main gymnasium was named "Coach K Court" in honour of Steve Konchalski.


DR. PETER MULLINS TROPHY
