SITE VISIT REPORT



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1. GENERAL INFORMATION

Host Country and the Host City of Lake Placid

Lake Placid, New York is located in the Adirondack State Park and is an ideal environment to host the Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games. The Adirondack State Park covers 24,281 km² of pristine wilderness in the northern region of New York State and is designated wilderness land. The limited development allowed in the park protects thousands of kilometers of wilderness which are perfect for winter sports. The region has attracted tourists for skiing, snowboarding, hiking, boating, fishing, wildlife spotting, as well as many other outdoor activities.

Useful Information

○ Weather

In Lake Placid and the surrounding area, summers are mild and comfortable, while the winters are typically cold and windy. During the winter, temperatures typically range from 23F to 4F (-5C to -15C). Lake Placid receives consistent snowfall during the winter months, with an average snowfall of 11.8 inches (30cm) in the month of January.

The currency in the United States is the U.S. Dollar (USD)

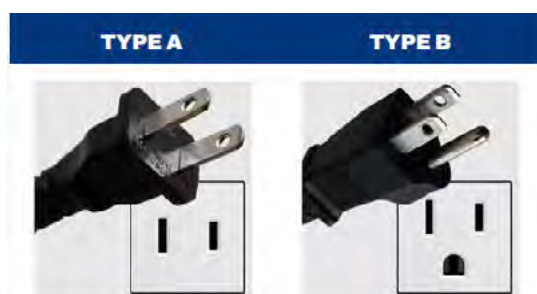

○ Electricity

Electrical sockets (outlets) in the U.S. are two standard electrical socket types:

- Type A plug (2 flat parallel pins)
- Type B plug (2 flat parallel pins and a grounding pin)

****120 volts is the standard voltage with a frequency of 60Hz.***



○ Emergency numbers

For all emergencies, please dial **911**. You can reach the police, fire and emergency medical services (e.g., an ambulance) by calling 911.

- **Canada to the U.S.:** Dial 1 + 3-digit area code + 7-digit phone number
- **U.S. to Canada:** Dial 011 + 1 + 10-digit phone number

- **Water**

Tap water is clean and safe to drink in the U.S.

- **Time Zone**

Lake Placid is in the North American Eastern Standard Time Zone (EST).

2. PRE-ARRIVAL INFORMATION

Visa

Canadian citizens do not require a visa for travel to the U.S. Please ensure your Passport is valid for at least six months.

Vaccinations

Non-U.S. citizens, non-U.S. immigrants must show proof of being fully vaccinated with the primary series of an accepted COVID-19 vaccine before boarding their flight to the United States. Proof of vaccination is also REQUIRED for all participants (coaches, athletes, medical personnel, medical and mission staff) in order to access their accreditation for the World University Games. **Participants are responsible for all costs associated with potential PCR testing both entering the U.S. and returning to Canada.** Approved vaccines are available here: <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/travelers/proof-of-vaccination.html#covid-vaccines>. More information related to COVID-19 protocols will be shared in future bulletins.

U SPORTS urges all participants to ensure that their standard immunization profile is up to date and that all supplementary vaccines are updated at least 4-6 weeks before departure to the U.S. The routine vaccines include measles-mumps-rubella (MMR), diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis, polio, varicella (chickenpox), influenza and others.

Medication

U SPORTS strongly urges all participants to bring with them to the U.S. sufficient medication for any current medical condition. Availability of certain medications in the U.S. may be limited. The Winter World University Games 2023 Organizing Committee strongly recommends having the prescription for all medicines for personal use, ready for presentation to the U.S. authorities, should it be required to reduce any unnecessary delays.

Travel and Medical Insurance

U SPORTS requires that each World University Games participant have out of country travel and medical insurance while participating at the Games. Policy numbers / details will be required for each participant. Lake Placid 2023 Organizing Committee will work with individuals' insurance companies to ensure there is no interruption in care.

Import/Export of pharmaceutical products by team doctors in accompanied or hand baggage

Athletes and teams participating in the World University Games can import medical items, medicines and equipment in their accompanied baggage.

Medicines and medical equipment intended for use during the Games for the purpose of treating the delegation and may be imported without paying customs and duties.

Medicines for up to 30 days per delegation competing athletes can be imported and must not exceed the sum of the individual volumes (baggage allowance).

Import / Export of Rifles and Ammunition

Biathlon rifles and ammunition are subject to specific importation procedures defined by the U.S. Customs and Border Protection. Prior to entering the U.S., athletes must pre-register their firearm and ammunition by completing an Application/Permit for Temporary Importation of Firearms and Ammunition by Nonimmigrant Aliens ([Form 5330.3D](#)) whether traveling by air or land.

To register firearms with the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF), athletes must submit their application forms to U SPORTS no later than Thursday, **November 3, 2022**. The Lake Placid 2023 FISU Games OC will review the applications and submit the forms to ATF for approval no later than Monday, November 7, 2022. Once approved or rejected, the Lake Placid 2023 FISU Games OC will notify NUSFs of approvals, where NUSFs will be responsible for passing on the application to the individual delegates.

Due to the lengthy approval process, the Organizing Committee does not guarantee the approval process for late submissions of the ATF 5330.3D forms.

Delegates arriving at the U.S. border must ensure they:

- Show proof they cleared customs when leaving their country of origin.
- Are in possession of a valid rifle license (or equivalent documents) according to the regulations in their country of origin.
- Present their firearms for a formal inspection process where the rifle must not have loaded rounds inside the magazine.
- Packed their ammunition in its original packaging.
- Are in possession of a copy of their approved ATF 5330.3D application.
- Possess the invitation letter from the Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games.

The temporary importation of rifles and ammunition into the U.S. is subject to both the re-exportation of the items and a valid rifle license (or equivalent permit) issued by the country of origin or declaration from the authorities in the country of exportation that a license is not required.

3. TRAVEL INFORMATION

Arrival

All athletes are to arrive 48 hours prior to their competition. Canadian teams can enter their respective Athletes Villages as of January 8th.

The official point of entry is the Albany International Airport (ALB). This is the only location from which meet and greet and transportation services to Villages will be provided.

Newark Liberty International Airport (EWR) in the state of New Jersey (approximately 471km south of Lake Placid) and Montreal-Pierre Elliott Trudeau International Airport (YUL) in Canada (approximately 184 km north of Lake Placid) will also be considered official ports of entry.

Participants who wish to make EWR or YUL their final arrival destination may rent a bus, SUV or sedan through the Lake Placid 2023 FISU Games' Rate Card program or may rent a vehicle on their own. No meet and greet services will be provided and transfers to Rate Card vehicles will be handled by a third-party transportation service.

The Organizing Committee will provide the following services only at ALB's Welcome Desk:

- Assistance with navigation through the airport
- Luggage trolley will be available free of charge next to the welcome desk
- Resolution of any arrival related issues (e.g. lost luggage)
- Providing instructions and directing participants to the loading area
- Extra luggage tags will be available and volunteers will support delegation members to ensure all luggage is properly identifiable

Excess Baggage

Each Canadian World University Games participant is responsible for his or her own excess baggage expenses. Please ensure baggage allowances are checked prior to travelling.

Luggage Tags

Luggage tags will be provided to each NSO / participant (with their Team Canada kit) and must be on all baggage for appropriate distribution of luggage at the Athlete Village.

4. FINANCES

U SPORTS 2023 Winter World University Games Participation Fee

U SPORTS will provide invoices to all teams for their U SPORTS Participation Fee at a rate of \$1,400 per participant. This cost includes full mission support, medical support, FISU entries fees, official non-competition team uniform and special events.

Accommodations Cost

U SPORTS will provide invoices to all teams for their Accommodations Cost at a rate of 95 USD per night. This cost includes all accommodations, meals, airport transfers from ALB and on-site transportation. The final nightly rate cost in Canadian dollars (CAD) will be determined based upon the exchange rate in November 2023.

Travel Cost

Each sport is required to plan and fund 100% of its own travel costs to the Winter World University Games. Copies of your travel itineraries must be provided to U SPORTS along with proof of medical / flight insurance for each participant.

Referee Fees (ITO Fees)

Sport delegations competing in the following sports must participate in covering the cost of international judges or referees to attend the World University Games:

5. ACCOMMODATIONS & MEALS

Accommodations

All accommodations and services are officially open to Canadian athletes and coaches on **January 8, 2023** and close on **January 23, 2023**. Teams cannot arrive prior this date and must depart by **January 23, 2023** (or **within 36 hours of their final competition**, whichever is sooner).

The Winter World University Games 2023 delegation members will be accommodated in existing facilities using a combination of local universities and hotels.

6. LOCAL TRANSPORTATION

Transportation Mall

The Organizing Committee provides transportation services to all accredited client groups. This includes scheduled bus and/or van services to the different venues, for competition and training, from Villages in the Central region, Village South (Great Escape) and Village West (Knowles Hall on the campus of SUNY Potsdam).

Transportation services are available from Olympic Center (OCN) Lot 1 (downtown Lake Placid Municipal Lot) for inter-village connectivity and for transport to the Main Medical Center (MMC) as well as Northwood School in the Central Region. In the South Region, transportation services are available from the Great Escape Lodge to Gore Mountain and Lake Placid and for the West Region, from Knowles Hall to Cheel Arena, Roos House and Lake Placid. Transport for spectating athletes is also available from these locations and will operate as per the set timetable in the Transportation Guide.

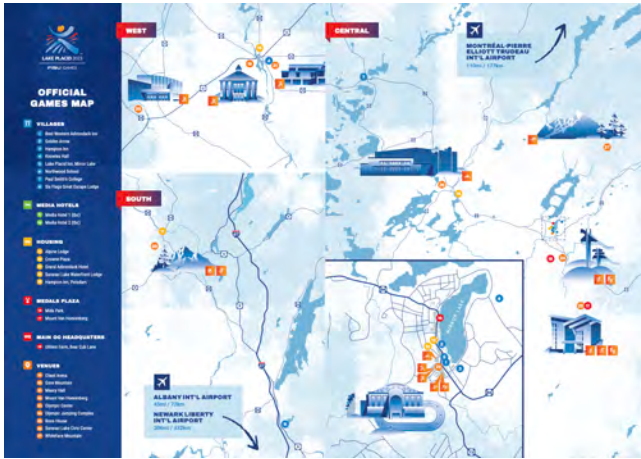

9. DELEGATION SERVICES

Delegation Attachés / Team Sport Attachés

Team Canada will be assigned local volunteers (attachés) to help support delegation activities. These attachés will be distributed amongst the sports and mission staff in order to support the Canadian delegation's activities. Attachés' will be available for a maximum of 8 hours per days from 6am – 11pm, an actual schedule will be coordinated as necessary. Hockey teams will each be assigned a designated attaché for the duration of their stay.

10. MEDIA SERVICES

Main Press Centre

The Main Press Centre (MPC) is located at 49 Parkside Drive in Lake Placid and is open from January 9 – 23, 2023. Only media representatives with an official Accreditation Card will be granted access to the Main Press Center.

Mixed Zones

Mixed zones, designed for brief communication between athletes and media representatives immediately after competition will be organized at every competition venue and will be located within the natural flow of athletes exiting the field of play. All athletes must pass through the mixed zone as they leave the field of play and are encouraged (but not obligated) to talk to media.

11. MEDICAL SERVICES & DOPING CONTROL

Medical Services

The Organizing Committee will provide:

Medical Support Services

- On-call (non-emergency) phone access to physicians 24/7.
- Emergent and non-emergent transportation to the dedicated medical facilities and hospitals providing specialized medical care.
- Assisting teams and delegations by providing medical personnel for outpatient treatment of their athletes and members.
- Interaction with the FISU International Medical Committee.
- Providing first aid and emergency medical care with ambulances at the competition venues during official training and competition, and at Paul Smith's College (VPS), Great Escape Lodge (VS1) and Knowles Hall (VW1).
- Providing specialized treatment, including high technology medical assistance, at the dedicated hospitals and specialized medical facilities.
- Providing medical assistance for spectators and athletes during official training and competition at the stationary medical stations at the competition venues.
- Providing medical assistance by mobile medical crews in the competition zone at the competition venues.
- Performing medical evacuation by means of helicopter from the competition venues, as needed, with regional aircraft on stand-by during Freestyle & Freeski and Snowboard, Alpine, Ski Jumping and Nordic Combined official training and competition.
- Providing medical assistance in the event of any emergency related to any infectious diseases.

- Providing primary medical and sanitary, specialized medical assistance, 24/7.
- Informing Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games participants of the conditions and procedures of medical assistance provision during competitions and events.

Medical Support Resources

- Medical station physicians (sports medicine physicians, general practitioners)
- Nurses
- Paramedics
- Mobile medical crews (Ski patrol, Emergency Medical Technicians, rescuers)
- Ambulance crews
- Physicians at dedicated hospitals
- Aircraft crews
- Sanitary and epidemiological surveillance specialists

Medical Support Structures

- Medical stations for athletes and spectators at the competition venues
- Mobile medical crews in the competition zones of the competition venues.
- Ambulance crews at the competition venues during official training and competition.
- Medical stations at Knowles Hall (VW1), Great Escape Lodge (VS1) and Paul Smiths College (VC1) and the Main Medical Center at Lake Placid Sports Medicine.
- Dedicated hospitals and specialized medical facilities.

Covid-19

The Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games' Organizing Committee will be requiring all delegation members participating in the Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games to be [fully vaccinated](#) from Covid-19.

Depending on the actual epidemiological situation, every delegation member will also have to present a negative Covid19 test within one (1) day of your departure/flight to the United States (currently, this requirement is suspended, but they expect it to be in effect during the Games).

As the Covid-19 pandemic continues to change, the Organising Committee expects to have mask mandates in place at all indoor and outdoor venues when six (6) feet of distance cannot be maintained. Screening procedures for all spectators at indoor venues (proof of full vaccination or a negative Covid-19 test), reduced capacity requirements for venues and testing procedures may also be implemented.

More detailed information will be coming shortly regarding Covid Protocols, but all Team Canada members will be required to provide proof of vaccination as part of their accreditation requirements.

Doping Control

Doping Control will be carried out in accordance with the World Anti-Doping Code and Regulations of FISU and will be available at all competition venues. The actual list of prohibited substances and methods is defined in accordance with WADA international standards. Ignorance of the Prohibited List will in no way constitute a valid excuse for any participant of the Games in violation of the anti-doping rules.

Doping control stations are located at each competition venue and the following Villages: Knowles Hall (VW1), Great Escape Lodge (VS1), Paul Smiths College (VPS) and the Main Medical Center in Lake Placid. The samples collected at competition venue doping control stations will be transported to the WADA approved laboratory in either Montreal, Canada, or the Sports Medicine Research and Testing Laboratory (SMRTL) in Utah (US).

Therapeutic Use Exemptions

All student-athletes requiring or currently holding a therapeutic exemption for a banned substance must ensure that the exemption is filed and approved with the Canadian Center for Ethics in Sport or the International Sports Federation prior to their arrival in the U.S.

12. TICKETING & CEREMONIES

Ticketing

Several ceremonies will take place throughout the duration of the World University Games:

- *Delegation Welcome Ceremony*
January 9-11, 2023
Venue: Mids Park, Lake Placid with broadcast to additional remote locations
Time: Approximately 10-15 minutes

Traditional ceremony done when more than 50% of the Canadian delegation arrives. This protocol event of the Games is held for each delegation in Mids Park will include welcome speeches, flag raising, FISU Anthem and cultural programming.

- *Opening Ceremonies*
January 12, 2023
Venue: Olympic Center (OCN), 1980 Rink, Herb Brooks Arena, Lake Placid
Time: 19h00 – 21h00 (approximately 2 hours)

Participants will march into the venue country by country wearing official Team attire.

- *Closing Ceremonies*
January 22, 2023
Venue: Olympic Center (OCN), 1980 Rink, Herb Brooks Arena, Lake Placid followed by Main Street Festival Celebration
Time: Starting at approximately 16:45, immediately after the Men's Ice Hockey Medal Ceremony (1980 rink, approximately 45 min; procession to Main Street Festival Celebration to follow)

Delegations will march through the venue with official Team attire.
