#### 5.4 Technical Regulations

The Alpine Skiing events will be organized in accordance with the most recent technical regulations of the International Ski Federation (FIS), except when specifically amended by these regulations or by the FISU Games International Technical Committee (FISU Games ITC).

The program and duration of the competitions will be fixed by the FISU Executive Committee in agreement with the Organizing Committee and the FISU Games ITC. In principle, the program will last eight (8) days and will include the following events:

#### Men

- o Super G (SG)
- o Giant Slalom (GS)
- o Slalom (SL)
- o Alpine Combined (AC)

#### Women

- o Super G (SG)
- o Giant Slalom (GS)
- o Slalom (SL)
- o Alpine Combined (AC)

#### Men/ Women

Mixed Team Parallel (TP)

Each country is authorized to enter a maximum of 12 athletes per gender (total 24 athletes).



In each event, each country may enter:

- o Individual events: maximum six (6) athletes (per gender)
- o Team events:
  - o Mixed Team Parallel: maximum one (1) team per country composed of two (2) W and 2 M.
  - o After the TP draw, changes or replacement of the racers are not allowed (even in case of injury)

Only athletes with an active FIS code are allowed to participate in each Alpine Skiing event.

To be eligible for participation in Super-G and Alpine Combined the athlete must have FIS points in Super-G, Alpine Combined or Downhill.

If an athlete does not yet appear in the valid FIS points list, he/she may only participate on the condition that an official results list containing his/her previous results is presented.

Entries are controlled by the Organizing Committee and the FIS Technical Delegate.

At the first General Technical Meeting, the Head of Delegation or his/her representative shall confirm and sign the official entry list of athletes.

Only with an accreditation card approved by the FISU International Control Committee (CIC) can an athlete be considered for the draw of a starting list and be entitled to participate in any of the competitions.

#### 5.4.1 JURY COMPOSITION

Members of Jury (Rules for FIS-UNI Competitions – Edition 2018/19):

In accordance with ICR Rules (601.4) for all events (men and women), the Jury must be nominated with the following members:

- o TD FIS (one (1) for men and one (1) for women nominated by FIS)
- o TD FISU-TCC (nominated by FISU) takes the function of Referee
- Assistant Referee (only for speed events) proposed by FISU and nominated by the TD FIS
- o Chief of Race (nominated by Organizing Committee)
- o The second (2nd) nominated TD FIS could be proposed to act as Start Referee or Finish Referee or video controller

All Jury members must be able to communicate with the Local Organizing Committee and with all Jury members by radio during the competitions (ICR 601.4.1.5) in one of the official FIS languages.



#### Connecting Coach

The Jury has the right to nominate a Connecting Coach at the Technical Committee's Meeting who will work together with the Jury and the other coaches but will not be a Jury member.

#### 5.4.2 PROTEST AND APPEAL

Any protest of a sport or disciplinary nature must reach the Jury according to the regulations laid down by the FIS. Such protest must be accompanied by a deposit in cash of CHF 100 or equivalent in the currency of the Organizing Committee (FIS ICR Art. 644; 644.4). This deposit will be returned if the protest is upheld.

Each Head of Delegation or his/her deputy is authorized to lodge an appeal against the decision of the Jury. This appeal must be submitted in writing to the Jury of Appeal or competent authority in accordance with the FIS regulations. Any decision of the Jury of Appeal or equivalent authority of a sport is final and must be reported immediately to the Head of Delegation of the country concerned.

Any sport disciplinary situation which cannot be satisfactorily resolved by the Sport Technical Committee (TC) and the sport-specific disciplinary regulations will be reported to the FISU Disciplinary Committee for further action to be taken. Where appropriate, a report will also be sent to FIS.

#### 5.5 Competition Format

#### 5.5.1 DRAWS SG, GS AND SL

- o Draw according to the FIS ICR art. 621.3. The starting order of the competitors in all Alpine Skiing competitions is determined by their FIS points in the concerned discipline. A first (1st) group with a maximum of the 15 best competitors present regardless of nationality, will be drawn.
- o The group may be increased if two (2) or more competitors share the 15th rank.
- o All remaining competitors start in order of their FIS points. All competitors without FIS points will be drawn in the last group.

#### 5.5.2 SUPER-G (SG)

- o FIS Race Level 1 (minimum FIS points penalty: 15)
- o The Super-G is carried out in one (1) run.

#### 5.5.3 GIANT SLALOM (GS)

- o FIS Race Level 1 (minimum FIS points penalty: 15)
- o The GS event consists of two (2) runs.



#### 5.5.4 SLALOM (SL)

- o FIS Race Level 1 (minimum FIS points penalty: 15)
- o The Slalom event consists of two (2) runs.

#### 5.5.5 ALPINE COMBINED

- o Starting numbers given to the competitors for the first run remain the same for all runs.
- o The results of Combined competitions are only counted for FIS points if the competitor finishes both combined races (SG and SL).
- o The Combined results are calculated by adding the race times of the single events or runs.
- o Each competitor finishing the first race of AC is qualified for the second (2<sup>nd</sup>) race.
- o The start order is determined for each event according to art. 621.
- o Only interim results may be published for those events or runs already completed. The official results are only published when all events or runs have been completed.
- o The sequence of the different races to be combined may be decided by the Organizing Committee and must be announced in the race notice and the program. Changes may be made by the Jury.

#### 5.5.6 MIXED TEAM PARALLEL

- o The Mixed Team Parallel event (SL version) will be conducted as a parallel using Giant Slalom gates and panels.
- o The total team size per Nation is limited to a maximum of 4 athletes (2 women and 2 men). A competitor can only start a run once.

#### Team Entry:

- o The teams' entry confirmations for the Mixed Team Parallel (TP) (with names of participating athletes) must be submitted at the TCM scheduled in Lake Placid on 11 January 2023.
- o Maximum 16 Teams may participate in the final phase.
- o If more than 16 teams enter the competition, then a qualification phase will be organized to assign the last places for the final. There will be a reset of the gates after the qualification phase.

#### Team Ranking:

o The teams will be ranked in accordance with the FIS - PWSL points, from lowest total points to highest.

Seeding of the Teams (FIS ICR 1212.5)

The teams entered will be seeded into eight (8) heats based upon their ranking. A bracket list will be arranged as follows:



- o Heat 1: Nation ranked 1 vs. Nation ranked 16
- o Heat 2: Nation ranked 8 vs. Nation ranked 9
- o Heat 3: Nation ranked 5 vs. Nation ranked 12
- o Heat 4; Nation ranked 4 vs. Nation ranked 13
- o Heat 5: Nation ranked 3 vs. Nation ranked 14
- o Heat 6: Nation ranked 6 vs. Nation ranked 11
- o Heat 7: Nation ranked 7 vs. Nation ranked 10
- o Heat 8: Nation ranked 2 vs. Nation ranked 15
- o The highest-ranking nation, according to the team ranking, will receive bib number 1 and the lowest ranking nation will receive the last bib number.
  - o Women will receive bibs starting from one (1), and Men starting from five (5), in alphabetical order. If a heat is incomplete, the remaining nation will automatically qualify for the next round (a bye).
- o For each individual leg of the heat, the competitor who is listed first, or respectively on top of the pairing, will start on the red course for his/her first run.

Following the order in the bracket, from top to bottom, all groups race in succession. For the second (2<sup>nd</sup>) individual leg of the heat, the competitors change courses. All subsequent runs are conducted using this system.

#### Running the Competition:

- o Each individual leg between two opponents consists of one (1) run.
- o The start order will be as follows (as an example for Heat 1):
- o "Course Red" Nation 1 W1 vs. "Course Blue" Nation last W1
- o "Course Red" Nation 1 M1 vs. "Course Blue" Nation last M1
- o "Course Blue" Nation 1 W2 vs. "Course Red" Nation last W2
- o "Course Blue" Nation 1 M2 vs. "Course Red" Nation last M2
- o The blue course will be located on the skier's right.
- o The starting order cannot be changed from one heat to the next.

#### Round of 16:

o The 16 teams start according to the start system in pairs from top to bottom. There are eight (8) that qualify for the quarterfinals. The lowest-ranked eight teams receive the same rank (9th).

#### Quarter Finals:

The eight (8) qualified teams start according to the start table. The lowest-ranked four (4) teams receive the same rank (5th).

#### Semi-Finals and Final:

The four (4) qualified teams start according to the start table. The lowest-ranked teams from the semi-finals race in the 3rd and 4th positions and the highest-ranked teams race in the 1st and 2nd



positions.

#### Points Scoring:

- o The winners of each individual leg score one (1) point for their Nation. In the event of a tie of an individual leg, both nations are awarded one (1) point.
- o If there is a tie at the end of the heat (example 2:2) the Nation with the lowest combined time of the best individual woman and the best individual man run time (or second best in the event of a tie for the best time) will win the heat.
- o If both competitors fall in any leg, the first competitor to reach the finish successfully will be announced as the winner. If both competitors fail to finish, the competitor who successfully skied the furthest distance will be announced as the leg winner.

#### Reasons for Disqualifications (immediate and without protest):

- o Changing from one course to another
- o Interfering with the opponent, accidentally or not
- o Not passing through a gate correctly (art. 661.4.2)
- o Stepping back (art. 614.2.3)

#### **5.7.1 CEREMONIES**

Mascot Ceremonies will be held immediately following the conclusion of the competition. In SL, AC and GS, the Mascot Ceremonies will be held after 30 runners have completed the second (2<sup>nd</sup>) run. Medal Ceremonies for Super-G, Alpine Combined, Giant Slalom, Mixed Team Parallel and Slalom will be held at Mid's Park – Medals Plaza.

#### 5.7.2 TRAINING

Official Free Skiing on Super-G courses takes place on 12 January. More details can be found below, in Section 5.8. Unofficial training is available 8-11 January, with transportation provided by the OC. Exact times for those training windows are still being finalized with OC Transportation, along with any applicable training booking process, and this will be communicated to all Delegations as soon as possible.

#### **5.7.3 RESERVE DAYS**

The OC will do its best to hold all competitions on the scheduled days. However, under exceptional weather conditions the competitions may have to be postponed/rescheduled. Two (2) reserve days are kept free, 16 January and 22 January.

#### 5.7.4 GENERAL TECHNICAL MEETING

- o The 1st General Technical Meeting (Team Captain's Meeting) will be held from 16:30 18:30 on 11 January 2023 at Northwood School (VNS).
- o The Head of Delegation or his/her representative and their coach must attend the 1st Technical Committee Meeting.
- o At the 1st General Technical Meeting, the Head of Delegation or his/her representative shall confirm and sign the official list of competitors. Only athletes with an active FIS code are allowed to participate in each Alpine Skiing event.
- o Entries are controlled by the Organizing Committee and the FIS Technical Delegate.
- o Only accredited athletes can be considered for the draw of a starting list.

Any further details and clarifications which are not yet described in the Technical Handbook will be communicated at the respective Team Captain's Meetings (please refer to the schedule above).

#### 5.8 Equipment

#### 5.8.1 COMPETITION UNIFORMS & EQUIPMENT

Clothing and equipment control will in principle follow FIS rules. The equipment control will be carried out in respect of the recent FIS technical regulations if no additional FISU rule is determined. Each competitor is responsible for the equipment that he/she uses (skis, bindings, poles, ski boots, suit, etc.). The term "competition equipment" encompasses all items of equipment which the competitor uses in competition. This includes clothing as well as apparatus with technical functions including helmets for SG and GS. The entire competition equipment forms a functional unit. All equipment used by athletes is governed by the FIS Specifications for Alpine Competition Equipment: See FIS Rules.

#### 5.8.3 STORAGE AND WAX ROOMS

The Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games will provide sport equipment storage and waxing rooms for the teams. All facilities are built and organized according to FISU and international requirements. Waxing rooms and cabins for Alpine will be provided on site at the Northwood School sport facility. Sections will be allocated to the respective nations and shared among their athletes.



The waxing rooms are equipped with special tables and equipment for preparing skis with lighting, several electric outlets\*, heating and ventilation, ski racks and waste bins.

#### **5.8.4 WAXING ROOM EQUIPMENT**

For Alpine, Freeski & Freestyle and Snowboard, the LOC will provide Swix waxing benches (expected model is T0075W – waxing bench wide) in each waxing cabin/area.

Each waxing area (for all relevant sports) will have an ample supply of U.S. 110v power, plug-ins and extensions.

The LOC will NOT be providing power converters/transformers, waxing irons, vises, profiles, etc. However, both Swix and Toko will offer online shopping options for each delegation. The offering is summarized as follows:

- o In late November 2022, the LOC sent each Delegation an invitation, instructions and custom access code for setting up their own Swix/Toko online shop for ordering discounted waxing and tuning equipment.
- Delegation or Team Managers must register and set up their team Swix/Toko website.
   Once properly registered, they are granted access to all Swix and Toko waxing and tuning supplies at special Lake Placid 2023 FISU Games pricing.
- o The deadline for orders is 31 December 2022. All orders for each delegation will be shipped to a designated onsite location at the Northwood School campus in Lake Placid. Each team order will have the delegation's name and contact person on the package for easy identification.
- o The Swix/Toko online shops will close 1 January 2023, giving us the necessary time to receive the products in Lake Placid and get them to the team waxing area locations.

#### 5.9 Doping Control

Doping Control will be carried out in accordance with the WADA World Anti-Doping Code and FISU regulations. Conditions for doping control procedures will be provided during the competitions at all sports venues.

#### 5.9.1 LIST OF PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

The actual list of prohibited substances and methods is defined in accordance with WADA international standards. National University Sports Federations will be responsible for ensuring that their delegations, namely athletes, are made aware of the actual copy of the prohibited list. Ignorance of the prohibited list contents will in no way constitute a valid excuse for any participant of the Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games violating valid FISU Anti-Doping Rules. For the current WADA list of prohibited substances and methods, please refer to the following website: www.wada-ama.org.



#### **5.9.2 TESTING**

The required number of samples will be selected during the "in-competition" and "out-of-competition" periods in accordance with the Test Distribution Plan. "In-competition" is defined as the period commencing 12 hours before a competition in which the athlete is scheduled to participate through to the end of such competition, and the sample collection process related to such competition. "Out-of-competition" is defined as any doping control which is not "incompetition." During the Lake Placid 2023 FISU Games, athletes can be tested at any time without prior notice. Urine and/or blood samples will be collected in compliance with the WADA International Standard for Testing and Investigations (ISTI). A paperless system will be used for the sample collection. The testing will be conducted by Doping Control Officers (DCO) from the U.S. Anti-Doping Agency (USADA), an anti-doping organization accredited by WADA. Testing will be conducted under the supervision of the FISU International Medical Committee. Doping samples will be sent to the WADA-accredited anti-doping laboratory (LAD) in Montreal, Canada. All results will be sent to the Chairman of the FISU International Medical Committee and entered into the ADAMS system. In the event of a violation of FISU Anti-Doping rules, the responsibility of processing the results lies with the FISU International Medical Committee.

In the event of setting a national record, doping testing of the athlete is carried out at the expense of his/her National University Sports Federation.

#### **5.9.3 DOPING CONTROL STATIONS**

Doping control stations are located at each sports venue or in close proximity. The main doping control station is located in the Host City of Lake Placid. All doping control stations will be marked with signs, including signage directing athletes to the stations. After the completion of the doping control procedure, all samples collected at each doping control station will be delivered to the central doping control station together with the necessary support documentation (doping control protocols) for further registration in the ADAMS system. All samples will be packaged and sent to the WADA accredited anti-doping laboratory in accordance with international standards. All information concerning the doping control program during the Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games is confidential according to WADA and FISU requirements. When visiting a doping control station, athletes are required to have accreditation cards.

The doping control station for Alpine athletes will be located at the Whiteface Base Lodge, across from the Medical Services Area.

o Doping control stations for out of competition controls and outside venue operating hours will be allocated at medical stations in various locations, including Knowles Hall, Great Escape, Paul Smith's College (the Health Center) and Lake Placid Sports Medicine. If testing outside of competition, athletes may be required to test at the medical station nearest them.



#### 5.9.4 THERAPEUTIC USE EXEMPTIONS (TUE)

Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games participants who require Therapeutic Use Exemptions (TUE) must make an appropriate request to their National Anti-Doping Organization or International Federation before participation in the Lake Placid 2023 FISU Games. The World Anti-Doping Agency International Standard for TUEs will be applied in this case. Every athlete who uses a substance or a method included in the list of prohibited substances is obliged to be in possession of a completed TUE form of the established standard from the moment of arrival until the departure from the Village after the Closing Ceremony of the Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games.

If there is a need for the use of a prohibited substance or a prohibited method for medical reasons after the opening of the Lake Placid 2023 FISU Games, an athlete must submit a request for TUE to the FISU International Medical Committee as a matter of urgency. The responsibility for completing the TUE form and submitting an application to the FISU International Medical Committee lies with the delegation physician.

If the delegation does not have its own physician, the athlete shall submit a request for TUE to the FISU International Medical Committee, with the attachment of medical documentation confirming the need for providing him/her with emergency medical treatment.

#### 5.10 Mascots and Medals

#### 5.10.1 MASCOT CEREMONY

Mascot Ceremonies will take place at the conclusion of each competition in the immediate vicinity of the Field of Play.

#### 5.10.2 MEDAL CEREMONY

- o The Medal Ceremonies will be held at the Mid's Park Medals Plaza according to the detailed day-by-day schedule (see Section 5.7).
- o The official language for the Medal Ceremonies will be English.
- o The medalists from each event must attend the Medal Ceremonies. In the event that a medalist is unable to attend, the medal is delivered to an official of the relevant delegation. He/she must be dressed in the delegation's official outfit. He/she must not mount the podium but stand behind it. The official awarding the medal will hand the medal and



mascot over the podium. During the FISU Anthem, the delegation official stands behind the podium.

- o In the event all medalists cannot be present, the Medal Ceremony will be postponed.
- o If an athlete or team is disqualified, the medal(s) shall be returned to FISU.

#### During the Medal Ceremony:

- o The athletes are not allowed to bring any national flag or any other national, cultural or religious symbol on the podium.
- o The national flags of the first three (3) medalists will be raised and the only anthem played will be the FISU Anthem, the Gaudeamus Igitur.
- o During the playing of the FISU Anthem and the raising of the flags, athletes shall face the flags and always conduct themselves in a dignified manner. No national anthem is played during the ceremony.
- o Athletes are expected to take off their caps and sunglasses when receiving their medal and keep items in hand throughout the ceremony (i.e., playing of the FISU Anthem and raising of the flags).
- o Athletes, authorities and accompanying persons are required to face the flags while they are being raised and the FISU Anthem is being played.
- o The medalists are expected to attend the ceremony in the uniforms they wore at the Opening Ceremony but are also allowed to attend the official ceremony wearing sport uniforms when the ceremony takes place immediately following the competition.
- o After the medals are awarded, athletes must remain in the awarding area for photos on the podium with medals.
- o In order to get the best photos, athletes should follow the recommendations of photographers.

#### 5.10.3 DIPLOMA OF HONOR

- o The athletes ranked one (1) to eight (8) will receive a Diploma of Honor.
- o For team events, each team member, from teams ranked one (1) to six (6), will receive a personal Diploma of Honor mentioning his/her name and the team ranking.
- o Diplomas of Honor are not distributed at the Medal Ceremony. They will be handed to the Head of Delegation or an appointed representative of each delegation prior to departure.
- o If an athlete or team is disqualified, the diploma(s) shall be returned to FISU.

#### 5.11 Media Interviews

Venue Media Centers for media representatives are organized at all Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games competition sites.

At the conclusion of a competition, all athletes must leave the Field of Play (FoP) through the mixed zone where brief interviews will be held. Every athlete/coach should be ready to communicate with media representatives upon their request. Team representatives should be



prepared to provide their athletes with a warm jacket or a blanket prior to entering the mixed zone.

A volunteer from the Venue Media Center will coordinate the exchanges between athletes/coaches and media. Support for translation in English will be provided during the mixed zone interviews. If an athlete/coach does not speak this language, they should invite their team interpreter to the mixed zone.

Media conferences are held at the beginning and the end of the Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games.

IMPORTANT: A personalized accreditation card with a photo, name and function of the cardholder carries information about the access rights and privileges available to him/her. Upon arrival, the accreditation card, equipped with a QR-code, enables members of delegations a 24-hour temporary access to the Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games venues in accordance with access rights on the accreditation card. The temporary access does not allow participation in the competition. After the CIC's approval, the accreditation card will be fully activated.



#### 6.2 Radio Frequency Control

At all Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games venues, any use of frequencies (e.g., on walkie-talkies, radio stations, wireless cameras, Wi-Fi access points, wireless microphones, FM-transmitters and any other wireless equipment), will require a temporary radio license from the Organizing Committee (OC). All Delegations have been contacted separately regarding radio frequency license requests. If anyone has not received or responded to this communication, please contact delegations@lakeplacid2023.com immediately.

Every wireless device must be registered by the frequency-organizer before it may be used.

- License-free\*: wireless microphones and in-ear monitoring systems, frequency range: 470-694 MHz
- License obligation: walkie-talkies (two (2)-way radio) and telemetry.

#### 6.3 Insurance and Responsibilities

Participating countries must adhere to the insurance requirements and conditions as stipulated in Section 5.6 of the FISU Games Winter General Regulations for the Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games.

Skiing and snowboarding off path:

Any participants skiing or snowboarding off the controlled slopes do so at their own risk. The Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games Organizing Committee does not accept any liability.

#### 6.4 Transportation

#### 6.4.1 TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM FOR ATHLETES AND TEAM OFFICIALS (TA)

The transportation system for athletes and team officials will provide transport services from 08-21 January 2023. Routes in the transportation system for athletes and official delegation members are marked with the abbreviation "TA" (Transport Athletes). Vehicles will be equipped with placards indicating route number for the individual and team sports and spectating athletes.




