5.4 Technical Regulations

The Ice Hockey events shall be organized in accordance with the most recent regulations of the International Ice Hockey Federation (IIHF), except when specifically amended by these regulations or by the FISU Games International Technical Committee (FISU Games ITC).

The program and duration of the competitions will be fixed by the Executive Committee in agreement with Lake Placid 2023 and the FISU Games ITC. In principle, the competitions will last 12 days maximum and will include:

Men	Women
12-team tournament	6-team tournament

Each country is authorized to enter a men's team and/or a women's team composed of a minimum of fifteen (15) players and two (2) goalkeepers, and a maximum of twenty (20) players and three (3) goalkeepers.

At the first General Technical Meeting, the Head of Delegation or his/her representative shall confirm and sign the official list of competitors.

Once the Head of Delegation/coach signs the list (roster) of players and goalkeepers, no change (replacements or additions) is permitted.

Only with an accreditation card approved by the FISU International Control Committee (CIC) can an athlete be considered for the roster and be entitled to participate in any of the games.

No player or team official under a current suspension from FISU, IIHF or the National Federation of his/her country may take part in the tournament.

On ice officiating system: "Four-man officiating system" (two referees and two linesmen). FISU Technical Committee Chairs may, at their sole discretion, apply the one-referee and two-linesmen system for games in the round robin.

5.4.1 PROTEST AND APPEAL

- Any protest of a sport or disciplinary nature must reach the Jury or other proper authority according to the regulations laid down by the IIHF. Such protest must be accompanied by a deposit, the amount of which is set in line with the IF regulations, if not otherwise specified in the technical regulations of concerned sport.
- Each Head of Delegation or his/her deputies are authorized to lodge an appeal against the decision of the Jury. This appeal must be submitted in writing to the Jury of Appeal or proper authority in accordance with the IIHF regulations.
- Any sport disciplinary situation which cannot be satisfactorily resolved by the Sport Technical Committee (TC) and the sport specific disciplinary regulations will be reported to

the FISU Disciplinary Committee for further action to be taken. Where appropriate, a report will be sent to IIHF.

5.5 Competition Format

5.5.1 ENTRIES

Twelve countries have qualified to enter teams and participate in accordance with FISU Lake Placid 2023 Regulations. Teams have been placed in two (2) groups based on FISU ranking.

5.5.2 NUMBER OF PLAYERS ON THE LINE-UP SHEET

- 60 minutes before the start of the game, a representative from each team must provide the scorekeeper with a line-up (list of names and corresponding jersey numbers for the players dressing), including the names of the captain(s) and alternate captain(s).
- Each team is allowed to dress a maximum of 20 skaters and 2 goaltenders for a game.
- Only eligible players are allowed to be listed on the line-up sheet and play in the game.
- If, during the course of a game, both goaltenders from a team are unable to play, the team will be allowed to dress a skater from the players' bench to play as a goaltender.
- The skater has 10 minutes to dress and be ready to play, but if he/she is ready before the 10-minute mark, he/she is allowed to use the remaining time for an on-ice warmup.

- With the exception of a third (3rd) goaltender, no alterations to the line-up are allowed once the game has started.

5.5.3 TOURNAMENT FORMAT

MEN

The format of the Men's Tournament comprises:

- PRELIMINARY ROUND played in two groups (30 games), from which 4 teams will qualify to the semi-finals.
- SEMI-FINAL ROUND (2 games)
- MEDAL ROUND (2 games) – Bronze Medal Game and Gold Medal Game

A game consists of three periods of 20 minutes (with two intermissions above 15 minutes, if not otherwise decided in the directorate) plus overtime and a penalty-shot shootout if required.

WOMEN

The format of the Women's Tournament comprises:

- PRELIMINARY ROUND played in one (1) group (15 games), from which four (4) teams will qualify for the semi-finals.
- SEMIFINAL ROUND (two (2) games)
- MEDAL ROUND (two (2) games) – Bronze Medal Game and Gold Medal Game.
- During the PRELIMINARY ROUND the teams will play a Round Robin. The four (4) highest-ranking teams from the group will qualify for the SEMIFINALS. The SEMIFINAL ROUND will be played as follows:
 - 1st place vs. 4th place
 - 2nd place vs. 3rd place

The two (2) winning teams will play in the Gold Medal Game and the two (2) losing teams will play in the Bronze Medal Game.

5.5.4 THREE-POINT SYSTEM (IIHF SPORT REGULATIONS)

For all games, points shall be awarded as follows:

- Three (3) points for the winning team at the conclusion of regulation time.
- One (1) point for both teams at the conclusion of regulation time if the game is tied.
- An additional point earned for the team that wins the game in a 5-minute overtime period, or the penalty-shot shootout if the teams are still tied following conclusion of the overtime period.
- Zero (0) points for the team that lost the game at the conclusion of regulation time.

5.5.5 TIE BREAKING SYSTEM (IIHF SPORT REGULATIONS)

The tie-breaking system for two (2) teams with the same number of points in a standing will be the winner of the game played between the two (2) teams. The winner of that game will receive the higher ranking.

Due to the fact that the three (3)-point system does not allow a game to end in a tie, the following tie breaking procedure is applicable when three (3) or more teams are tied in points in a championship standing.

Should three (3) or more teams be tied in points, then a tie breaking formula will be applied as follows: creating a sub-group amongst the tied teams. This process will continue until only two (2) or none of the teams remain tied. In the event of two (2) remaining tied teams, the game between the teams would then be the determining tiebreaker, as the game could not end as a tie. FISU special regulations: in any event when the goal difference will be decisive, only a 10-goal difference per game will be taken into account.

Step 1:

Taking the games between each of the tied teams into consideration, a sub-group is created, applying the points awarded in the direct games amongst the tied teams, from which the teams are then ranked accordingly.

Step 2:

Should three (3) or more teams still remain tied in points, the highest goal differential in the direct games amongst the tied teams will rank the highest.

Step 3:

Should three (3) or more teams still remain tied in points and goal difference, then the highest number of goals scored by these teams in their direct games will determine the ranking.

Step 4:

Should three (3) or more teams still remain tied in points, goal difference and goals scored, the results between each of the teams and the closest, highest-ranked team outside the subgroup will be applied. In this case, the tied team with the best result (1. points, 2. goal difference, 3. more goals scored) against the closest, highest-ranked team will take precedence.

Step 5:

Should the teams still remain tied, then the results between each of the three (3) teams and the next highest-ranked team outside the sub-group will be applied.

Step 6:

Should the teams still remain tied after these five (5) steps have been exercised, sport considerations will be applied, and the teams will be ranked by their positions coming into the Championship (i.e., seeding).

The IIHF Tie Breaking System will be used to resolve ties before the end of the Preliminary Round.

In the event where two (2) teams are tied and they have not yet played against each other, and in the event where three (3) or more teams are tied and not all mutual games have been played within the sub-group, the following criteria will be used to break the tie:

1. Fewest number of games played
2. Highest goal differential (GF-GA) in all games
3. Highest number of goals for (GF) in all games
4. Highest tournament seeding entering the tournament

In the event of three (3) or more tied teams, this process will continue until only two (2) teams remain tied. The game between the two (2) remaining tied teams would then be the determining tiebreaker. If the two (2) remaining tied teams have not played each other, the tie break will be determined by re-starting the process only for these two (2) teams.

5.5.6 OVERTIME OPERATIONS (IIHF SPORT REGULATIONS)

Overtime – Operations for a Round Robin or for a Preliminary Round Game

If, at the end of the three (3) 20-minute periods in a single Round Robin championship or the Preliminary Round of a top category championship, the two (2) teams playing are tied, the teams will then play a 'sudden death' overtime period of five (5) minutes. The team that scores first will be declared the winner. The overtime period shall be played with each team at a numerical strength of three (3) skaters and one (1) goaltender. The overtime period will commence following a three (3)-minute intermission.

Once the intermission has been completed, the clock will be reset to five (5) minutes and the overtime period will begin immediately. Teams will not change ends. The players will remain on their respective benches during the three (3)-minute intermission. Goaltenders must go to their respective benches during this rest period; however, penalized players must remain in the penalty box.

Should a penalized player exit the penalty box, he/she shall be returned immediately by the game officials with no additional penalty being assessed, unless he/she commits an infraction of any other rule. Teams are not permitted to return to the dressing room during this time.

Penalties

If regulation time ends and the teams are 5 on 3, teams will start the overtime period 5 on 3. Once player strength reaches 5 on 4 or 5 on 5, at the next stoppage of play, player strength is adjusted to 4 on 3 or 3 on 3, as appropriate. If regulation time ends and teams are 4 on 4, teams will start the overtime period 3 on 3.

Once player strength reaches 4 on 4, at the next stoppage of play, player strength is adjusted to 3 on 3. If, at the end of regulation time, teams are 3 on 3, overtime starts 3 on 3. Once player strength reaches 4 on 4, 5 on 4 or 5 on 5, at the next stoppage, player strength is adjusted to 3 on 3 or 4 on 3, as appropriate. At no time will a team have less than three (3) players on the ice. This may require a fourth (4th) and/or fifth (5th) skater to be added in the event that penalties are assessed. If a team is penalized in overtime, teams play 4 on 3. If both teams are penalized with minor penalties at the same stoppage of play (with no other penalties in effect), teams will continue to play 3 on 3.

In overtime, if a team is penalized such that a two (2)-man advantage is called for, then the offending team will remain at three (3) skaters while the non-offending team will be permitted five (5) skaters. At the first stoppage of play after the two (2)-man advantage is no longer in effect, the numerical strength of the teams will revert back to 4 on 3 or 3 on 3, as appropriate.

Overtime – Operations for Semifinals or for the Bronze Medal Game

- If, at the end of the three (3) 20-minute periods of the semifinal games or the Bronze Medal Game, the two (2) playing teams are tied, the teams will then play a 'sudden death' overtime period of 10 minutes, with the team that scores first being declared the winner.
- The overtime period shall be played with each team at a numerical strength of three (3) skaters and one (1) goaltender.
- The overtime period will commence following a three (3)-minute intermission. Once the intermission has been completed, the clock will be reset to 10 minutes and the overtime period will begin immediately.
- Teams will not change ends. The players will remain on their respective benches during the three (3) minutes. Goaltenders must go to their respective benches during this rest period; however, penalized players must remain in the penalty box. Should a penalized player exit the penalty box, he/she shall be returned immediately by the game officials with no additional penalty being assessed, unless he/she commits an infraction of any other rule.
- Teams are not permitted to return to the dressing room during this time.

Penalties

- When regulation time ends, and the teams are 5 on 3, teams will start the overtime period 5 on 3. Once player strength reaches 5 on 4 or 5 on 5, at the next stoppage of play, player strength is adjusted to 4 on 3 or 4 on 4, as appropriate. When regulation time ends, and teams are 4 on 4, teams will start overtime 4 on 4.

- Once player strength reaches 5 on 4 or 5 on 5, at the next stoppage, player strength is adjusted to 4 on 3 or 4 on 4, as appropriate. If, at the end of regulation time, teams are 3 on 3, overtime starts 3 on 3. Once player strength reaches 4 on 4, 5 on 4 or 5 on 5, at the next stoppage of play, player strength is adjusted to 4 on 3 or 4 on 4, as appropriate. At no time will a team have less than three (3) players on the ice. If a team is penalized in overtime, teams play 4 on 3. If both teams are penalized with minor penalties at the same stoppage of play (with no other penalties in effect), teams will continue to play 4 on 4. In overtime, if a team is penalized such that a two (2)-man advantage is called for, then the offending team will remain at three (3) skaters while the non-offending team will be permitted five (5) skaters. At the first stoppage of play after the two (2)-man advantage is no longer in effect, the numerical strength of the teams will revert to 4 on 3 or 4 on 4, as appropriate.

Overtime – Operations for the Gold Medal Game

- If, at the end of the three (3) 20-minute periods in a Gold Medal Game the two (2) playing teams are tied, the teams will then play a 'sudden death' overtime period of 20 minutes with the team that scores first being declared the winner. The overtime period shall be played with each team at a numerical strength of three (3) skaters and one (1) goaltender.
- The overtime period will commence following an ice resurfacing during a 15-minute intermission where the teams will return to their dressing room before the start of the overtime period. Teams will not change ends.

5.5.7 PENALTY-SHOT SHOOTOUT PROCEDURE (IIHF SPORT REGULATIONS)

- If, following the completion of regulation time in any IIHF Championship game the score of the game is tied, the teams will then play an overtime period with a maximum duration and number of players as specified in the IIHF Sport Regulations with the team that scores first being declared the winner.
- If no goal is scored in the overtime period, then the IIHF Penalty-Shot Shootout Procedure will apply. The following procedure will be utilized:
 - Shots will be taken at both ends of the ice surface. The 14-meter-wide longitudinal center section of the rink, between the face-off dots in the neutral and end zones, will be dry scraped by the ice-resurfacing machine prior to the Penalty-Shot Shootout during the time required to organize the program accordingly.
 - The procedure will begin with five (5) different shooters from each team taking alternate shots. The players do not need to be named beforehand. Players eligible to participate in the Penalty-Shot Shootout will be the four (4) goalkeepers and all players from both teams listed on the official game sheet, except as specified in article 3 below.
 - Any player whose penalty had not been completed when the overtime period ended is not eligible to be one of the players selected to take the penalty shots

and must remain in the penalty box or in the dressing room. Also, players serving penalties assessed during the Penalty Shot Shootout must remain in the penalty box or in the dressing room until the end of the procedure.

- The Referee will call the two (2) captains to the Referee Crease and flip a coin to determine which team takes the first shot. The winner of the coin toss will have the choice whether his/her team will shoot first (1st) or second (2nd).
- The goalkeepers shall defend the same goal as in the overtime period and may remain at their goal creases while the opposing team is taking a shot.
- The goalkeepers from each team may be changed after each shot.
- The shots will be taken in accordance with Rule 63 of the IIHF Official Rule Book.
- The players of both teams will take the shots alternately until a decisive goal is scored. The remaining shots will not be taken.
- If the score is still tied after all shots are taken by each team, the procedure shall continue with a tiebreak shoot-out, using the same, or new, players. The team that shot second (2nd) in the first five (5) penalty shots will start first in the tie-break shots. The game shall be finished as soon as a duel of two (2) players brings the decisive result. The same player can be used for each shot by a team in the tie-break shoot-out.
- The official scorekeeper will record all shots taken, indicating the players, goalkeepers and goals scored.
- Only the decisive goal will count toward the result of the game. It shall be credited to the team that scored the goal and charged against the team that was scored upon.
- If a team declines to participate in the Penalty-Shot Shootout, the game will be declared as a loss for that team and the other team will be awarded three (3) points for a win. If a player declines to take a shot it will be declared “no score” for his/her team.

5.7.2 GENERAL TECHNICAL MEETINGS

The 1st General Technical Meeting (Directorate #1) for Men will be held at 18:00, 10 January 2023, at Cheel Arena.

The 1st General Technical Meeting (Directorate #1) for Women will be held at 18:30, 10 January 2023, at Maxcy Hall.

All team managers must attend this meeting. At the 1st General Technical Meeting, the Head of Delegation or his/her representative shall confirm and sign the official list of players.

Any further details and clarifications which are not yet described in the Technical Handbook will be communicated at the respective Directorates' Meetings (see schedule in the table above).

5.8 Equipment

Ice Hockey Uniforms

- Each team must have at least two (2) full sets of jerseys and socks (one (1) set in light colors and one (1) set in dark colors), including two (2) extra jerseys for both sets. The basic color must cover, at least, approximately 80% of each item (excluding the player's name and number).

- Each team's players must be dressed uniformly in helmets, jerseys, pants and socks, with the jerseys and socks matching in color; except for the goaltender who may wear a helmet of different design and color to the rest of the team.
- Each player must have his/her surname on the back of the upper part of the jersey in block Latin letters, 10 cm high.
- Each player must have his/her number on the back of his/her jersey, between 25 and 30 cm high, and on the upper part of each sleeve, 10 cm high. Numbers are restricted to 1-99. Players must play with the same number throughout the competition.

Advertising on the uniforms shall follow FISU Ice Hockey Uniform guidelines. Any logo or advertising not following these rules and guidelines must be removed/hidden from the uniforms. The uniform must be controlled by the FISU Winter Games Department and the FISU Marketing Department. Two (2) weeks prior to production – at the latest three (3) months before the event, photos of the front, back and each side (sleeves) of each uniform must be sent to the FISU Winter Games Department (wintergames@fisunet) and the FISU Marketing Department (marketing@fisunet). The photo format needs to be as follows: JPEG file, maximum resolution and size 300dpi/500 KB. During the 1st General Technical Meeting (GTM), the Organizing Committee and FISU TCC, in coordination with FISU Marketing Department, will conduct a second (2nd) control on site.

5.9 Doping Control

Doping Control will be carried out in accordance with the WADA World Anti-Doping Code and FISU regulations. Conditions for doping control procedures will be provided during the competitions at all sports venues.

5.9.1 LIST OF PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

The actual list of prohibited substances and methods is defined in accordance with WADA international standards. National University Sports Federations will be responsible for ensuring that their delegations, namely athletes, are made aware of the actual copy of the prohibited list. Ignorance of the prohibited list contents will in no way constitute a valid excuse for any participant of the Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games violating valid FISU Anti-Doping Rules. For the WADA list of prohibited substances and methods please refer to the following website: www.wada-ama.org.

5.9.2 TESTING

The required number of samples will be selected during the “in-competition” and “out-of-competition” periods in accordance with the Test Distribution Plan. “In-competition” is defined as the period commencing 12 hours before a competition in which the athlete is scheduled to participate through to the end of such competition, and the sample collection process related to

such competition. “Out-of-competition” is defined as any doping control which is not “in-competition.” During the Lake Placid 2023 FISU Games, athletes can be tested at any time without prior notice. Urine and/or blood samples will be collected in compliance with the WADA International Standard for Testing and Investigations (ISTI). A paperless system will be used for the sample collection. The testing will be conducted by Doping Control Officers (DCO) from the U.S. Anti-Doping Agency (USADA), an anti-doping organization accredited by WADA. Testing will be conducted under the supervision of the FISU International Medical Committee. Doping samples will be sent to the WADA-accredited anti-doping laboratory (LAD) in Montreal, Canada. All results will be sent to the Chairman of the FISU International Medical Committee and entered into the ADAMS system. In the event of a violation of FISU Anti-Doping rules, the responsibility of processing the results lies with the FISU International Medical Committee.

In the event of setting a national record, doping testing of the athlete is carried out at the expense of his/her National University Sports Federation.

5.9.3 DOPING CONTROL STATIONS

Doping control stations are located at each sports venue or in close proximity. The main doping control station is located in the Host City of Lake Placid. All doping control stations will be marked with signs, including signage directing athletes to the stations. After the completion of the doping control procedure, all samples collected at each doping control station will be delivered to the central doping control station together with the necessary support documentation (doping control protocols) for further registration in the ADAMS system. All samples will be packaged and sent to the WADA accredited anti-doping laboratory in accordance with international standards. All the information concerning the doping control program during the Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games is confidential according to WADA and FISU requirements. When visiting a doping control station, athletes are required to have accreditation cards.

Doping control stations for Ice Hockey athletes competing in finals will be located in the Olympic Center- one (1) level below the arena. There will be a locker room for the processing station, and then a second for the waiting area right across the hall. Doping Control stations will also be at Maxcy Hall, Cheel Arena and Roos House.

Doping control stations for out of competition controls and outside venue operating hours will be located at medical stations in various locations, being Knowles Hall, Great Escape, Paul Smith’s College (the Health Center) and Lake Placid Sports Medicine. If testing outside of competition, athletes may be required to test at the medical station nearest them.

5.9.4 THERAPEUTIC USE EXEMPTIONS (TUE)

Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games participants who require Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) must make an appropriate request to the National Anti-Doping Organization or International Federation before participation in the Lake Placid 2023 FISU Games. The World Anti-Doping Agency International Standard for TUE will be applied in this case. Every athlete who uses a substance or a method included in the list of prohibited substances is obliged to be in

possession of a completed TUE form of the established standard from the moment of arrival until the departure from the Village after the Closing Ceremony of the Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games.

If there is a need for the use of a prohibited substance or a prohibited method for medical reasons after the Opening Ceremony of the Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games, an athlete must submit a request for TUE to the FISU International Medical Committee as a matter of urgency. The responsibility for completing the TUE form and submitting an application to the FISU International Medical Committee lies with the delegation physician.

If the delegation does not have its own physician, the athlete shall submit a request for TUE with the attachment of medical documentation confirming the fact of providing him/her with emergency medical treatment to the FISU International Medical Committee.

5.10 Mascots and Medals

5.10.1 MASCOT CEREMONY

Mascot Ceremonies will be combined with Medal Ceremonies for Ice Hockey.

5.10.2 MEDAL CEREMONY

- The Medal Ceremonies will be held at the Olympic Center's 1980 Herb Brooks Arena according to the detailed day-by-day schedule, as shown in Section 5.7.
- The official language for the Medal Ceremony will be English.
- The medalists of each event must attend the Medal Ceremony. In the event that a medalist is unable to attend, the medal will be delivered to an official of the relevant delegation. He/she must be dressed in the delegation's official outfit. He/she must not mount the podium but stand behind it. The awarders will hand the medal and mascot over the podium. During the FISU Anthem, the delegation official stands behind the podium.
- In the event that all medalists cannot be present, the Medal Ceremony will be postponed.

- If an athlete or team is disqualified, the medal(s) shall be returned to FISU.

During the Medal Ceremony:

- The athletes are not allowed to bring any national flag or any other national, cultural or religious symbol on the podium.
- The national flags of the first three (3) medalists will be raised and the only anthem played will be the FISU Anthem, the Gaudeamus Igitur.
- During the playing of the FISU Anthem and the raising of the flags, athletes shall face the flags and always conduct themselves in a dignified manner. No national anthem is played during the ceremony.
- Athletes are expected to take off their caps and sunglasses when receiving their medal and keep items in hand throughout the ceremony (i.e., playing of the FISU Anthem and raising of the flags).
- Athletes, authorities and accompanying persons are required to face the flags while they are being raised and the FISU Anthem is being played.
- The medalists are expected to attend the ceremony in the uniforms they wore at the Opening Ceremony but are also allowed to attend the official ceremony wearing sport uniforms when the ceremony takes place immediately following the competition.
- After the medals are awarded, athletes must remain in the awarding area for photos on the podium with medals.
- In order to get the best photos, athletes should follow the recommendations of photographers.

5.10.3 DIPLOMA OF HONOR

- The athletes ranked one (1) to eight (8) will receive a Diploma of Honor.
- For team events, each team member, from teams ranked one (1) to six (6), will receive a personal Diploma of Honor mentioning his/her name and the team ranking.
- Diplomas of Honor are not distributed at the Medal Ceremony. They are handed to the Head of Delegation or an appointed representative of each delegation prior to departure.
- If an athlete or team is disqualified, the diploma(s) shall be returned to FISU.

5.10.4 DIPLOMA OF MERIT

- For team sports, to the officials of medalist teams who are mentioned on the match sheet of their respective final game.

5.11 Media Interviews

- Venue Media Centers for media representatives are organized at all Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games competition sites.

- At the end of a competition, all athletes must leave the Field of Play through the mixed zone, where brief interviews will be held. Every athlete/coach should be ready to communicate with media representatives upon their request. Team representatives should be prepared to provide athletes with a warm jacket or a blanket prior to entering the mixed zone.
- A volunteer from the Venue Media Center will coordinate the exchanges between athletes/coaches and media.
- Support for translation in English will be provided during the mixed zone interviews. If an athlete/coach does not speak this language, they should invite their team interpreter to the mixed zone.
- Media conferences are held at the beginning and the end of the Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games.

6. SERVICE INFORMATION

6.1 Team Services

6.1.1 TEAM SERVICE OFFICE

Team Service information can be retrieved from the Sport Information Desk at the venue or at the Service desk located at Knowles Hall.

6.1.2 TEAM SPORT ATTACHÉ

An additional attaché will be assigned to each Ice Hockey team for the entirety of their stay in Lake Placid. Team sport attachés will work on a flexible schedule, coordinated by the team leader/coach of the team.

Team sport attachés' responsibilities, generally, are as follows:

- Assistance during arrivals and departures of the delegations.
- Assistance with accreditation procedure, Village check-in and check-out procedures.

- Assistance with navigation in the Village and at the Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games venues, in the Village of Lake Placid.
- Assistance to the team at competition and training venues, UV, SIC and Sport Information Desks, the team's daily tasks management and solving any issues that may arise.
- Providing information regarding the competition and training schedule and any changes to the schedule.
- Assistance in ordering transportation for the team.
- Accompany the team to other Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games venues or the Village of Lake Placid, on request.
- Language support including unofficial consecutive interpreting.
- Information and communication support attachés are not obliged to follow the instructions of the team members not related to participation in the Lake Placid 2023 FISU Games. The transfer of documents, money and other valuables to attachés is not permitted.

6.1.3 DRESSING ROOMS

Each team will have a permanent dressing room during the tournament and extra coaches rooms. The storage area is located within the team area. Each team will receive lockers for storage reasons. Dressing rooms will be cleaned daily after each practice and game.

Each team (players and coaches) is asked to bring their own skate guards.

6.1.4 SKATE SHARPENING & EQUIPMENT REPAIR

A sharpening room is available for all teams. Each team is provided with a table for skate sharpening. Each team must bring its own skate sharpening machine, or, alternatively to share one made available at each venue.

In the event that external skate sharpening or equipment repair is required, please contact the Sport Information Desk and we will organize it for you. Skate sharpening is not allowed in front of the designated dressing room, only in the designated sharpening room.

6.1.5 LAUNDRY SERVICE

- Laundry service is provided by Team Services after each ice session.
- The laundry service only applies to sportswear (underwear, jerseys and socks). The sportswear must be delivered in a personal laundry bag. No laundry bags will be provided for the players, so each Delegation should bring its own.
- The laundry will be picked up by the LOC team service and delivered to and from your dressing room in a laundry trolley/roller container.
- The laundry bags must be brought by yourself and must be coded with the country name/color of the country. Please mark the name of the player on the label of the laundry loop with a waterproof marker. All garments, e.g., underwear, practice jerseys, socks, with

the exception of team jerseys, are washed in the laundry bags, which are not opened during the laundry process.

- Do not forget to close the loop carefully. Each team should leave their laundry bags in the same laundry trolley/roll container.

6.1.6 TOWELS

Each team is provided with 30 shower towels and 30 small towels each day.

6.1.7 PENALTY BOX

- Sealed water bottles, paper tissues and ice bags will be available in both penalty boxes during the game.
- Teams are allowed to bring their own drinks to the penalty box.

6.1.8 FITNESS ROOM AND BIKES

Bikes are available in designated warm-up areas.

Bikes are primarily reserved for the teams preparing for games. The bikes are split between the home and away teams. Teams are not allowed to move the bikes outside the fitness room.

All teams will also have access to fitness areas ((including gymnasiums, workout areas and a swimming pool) in Maxcy Hall throughout the Games. All teams will have access to shower areas in Maxcy Hall should they choose to make use of these fitness areas (and don't already have their own dedicated locker room in this venue).

6.1.9 OTHER ARENA SERVICES

- Water: Each team will be provided with enough water. Teams will bring their own drinking bottles to their respective benches. Drinks will be available in the team's dressing room.
- Fruits/Snacks will be available for both practices and games.
- Ice: Ice will be available both in the competition arenas as well as in the Village.

6.1.10 PUCKS

Practice pucks will be at the bench before practices. Teams are kindly advised to collect pucks from the ice after practice and return the pucks to the bench for the next team to practice. Only pucks provided from the OC are allowed to be used on ice.

Game warm-up pucks will be delivered to the team bench before the warm-up. OC staff will collect the pucks from the ice after the warm-up.

6.1.11 ICE PRACTICES - CANCELLATION

If a team is not using the scheduled ice slot for practice, the team attaché or team manager should inform the Sport Information Desk immediately, but no later than 12:00 noon the day before. Teams may also manage their practice schedules directly on the Calendly link provided to them.

IMPORTANT: A personalized accreditation card with a photo, name and function of the cardholder carries information about the access rights and privileges available to him/her. Upon arrival, the accreditation card, equipped with a QR-code, enables members of delegations a 24-hour temporary access to the Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games venues in accordance with the access rights on the accreditation card. The temporary access does not allow participation in the competition.

After the CIC approves the accreditation card, it will be fully activated.

6.3 Radio Frequency Control

At all Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games venues, any use of frequencies (e.g. on walkie-talkies, radio stations, wireless cameras, Wi-Fi access points, wireless microphones, FM-transmitters and any other wireless equipment), will require a temporary radio license from the Organizing Committee (OC). All Delegations have been contacted separately regarding radio frequency license requests. If anyone has not received or responded to this communication, please contact delegations@lakeplacid2023.com immediately.

Every wireless device must be registered by the frequency-organizer before it may be used.

- License-free*: wireless microphones and in-ear monitoring systems, frequency range: 470-694 MHz
- License obligation: walkie-talkies (two (2)-way radio) and telemetry.

* Only a limited number of shared frequencies are available. Registration is mandatory and such equipment will not have a dedicated channel.

6.4 Insurance and Responsibilities

Participating countries must adhere to the insurance requirements and conditions as stipulated in Section 5.6 of the FISU Winter Games General Regulations for the Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games.
