#### 1. EVENT INFORMATION UPDATE

#### **2023 FISU WINTER WORLD UNIVERSITY GAMES**

The 31<sup>st</sup> FISU Winter World University Games will take place in the city of Lake Placid, New York, USA which is a village in the Adirondack Mountains in Essex County, New York, United States. The 2023 FISU Winter World University Games is scheduled to take place from Thursday January 12 to Sunday January 22, 2023. Team Canada has committed to sending a delegation of approximately 172 athletes and officials (staff).

#### **EVENT TICKETS**

Athletes and staff do not require tickets to attend any event, with the exception of the hockey semi-finals and finals, the curling final and the skating exhibition. Designated areas for delegation members will be provided at each venue but are first come, first served.

#### COVID-19

The Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games' Organizing Committee will be requiring all delegation members participating in the Lake Placid 2023 FISU World University Games to be fully vaccinated from Covid-19.

Depending on the actual epidemiological situation, every delegation member will also have to present a negative Covid-19 test within one (1) day of your departure/flight to the United States (currently, this requirement is suspended, but they expect it to be in effect during the Games).

As the Covid-19 pandemic continues to change, the Organising Committee expects to have mask mandates in place at all indoor and outdoor venues when six (6) feet of distance cannot be maintained. Screening procedures for all spectators at indoor venues (proof of full vaccination or a negative Covid-19 test), reduced capacity requirements for venues and testing procedures may also be implemented.

More detailed information will be coming shortly regarding Covid Protocols, but all Team Canada members will be required to provide proof of vaccination as part of their accreditation requirements.

#### **TEAM LEADER SIM CARDS**

U SPORTS will supply American voice and data bundle SIM cards for each Team Leader at the 2023 Winter World University Games. In an effort to provide this service, we will be requiring that all Team Leaders use an existing smartphone already in their possession.

Team Leaders will be provided with a SIM card in advance of their departure from Canada so that they are able to access the voice and data packages immediately upon arrival in the United States. Team Leader SIM card package will be provided in the Team Leader Team Canada Kit that will be shipped out in December.

Team Leaders <u>MUST</u> use this SIM card as their primary means of communications with Team Canada Mission Staff. SIM cards must be returned after the World University Games, otherwise a replacement fee will be charged.

Tip: In order to quickly and easily insert your SIM card, be sure to carry with you the small tool typically provided with your cell phone designed for this purpose or a small paper clip to insert into the SIM card hole on the phone.

## 4. TEAM CANADA ACCREDITATION & REQUIREMENTS

# **ACCREDITATION**

All accreditation entry documents for athletes, coaches, team staff and mission staff must be submitted to U SPORTS by the Team Leader no later than **Monday, November 21**<sup>st</sup>. For a listing of all accreditation requirements, details, forms, and links please visit the <u>U SPORTS 2023 Winter World University Games</u> website under the Team Canada Accreditation section. Please note the specific requirements for each accreditation document and do not hesitate to reach out to U SPORTS should you have any questions.

Each Team Canada member will be required to submit the following:

- 1. Team Canada Entry Form (including travel details)
- 2. Team Agreement
- 3. FISU Academic Eligibility Form (athletes only)
- 4. Copy of Picture Page of Passport
- 5. Headshot Photograph
- 6. Medical Questionnaire
- 7. Proof of COVID-19 Vaccination
- 8. Safe Sport Training Certification
- 9. Fees

#### **TRAVEL & INSURANCE**

Each team is responsible for the booking of travel to and back from the United States. Arrival and departure travel details are also due on **Monday, November 21**<sup>st</sup> and must be submitted through the Team Canada Entry Form. Please ensure travel dates as outlined in the note below are respected. The Organizing Committee provides a transportation service at a cost from the Montreal Airport. If you would like more information on this, please contact U SPORTS by November 10th.

<u>Note:</u> Athletes taking part in the FISU Games competitions must arrive in the Village at least 48 hours before their first sport event. Athletes and coaches must be checked out of their accommodations in the athlete's village within 36 hours of their sport's final event or final reserve day, and no later than January 23rd, 2023.

All Team Canada members are required to secure their own health and accident insurance coverage (policy number and company name will be requested in the Team Canada Entry Form).

## **COACHING CERTIFICATION STANDARDS (REMINDER)**

U SPORTS' Coaching Certification Policy applies to all coaches representing Canada at the World University Games. It is important for U SPORTS to ensure a high quality of coaching at all games in an effort to produce high quality athletes and performances.

National Coaching Certification Program (NCCP) Competition-Development Certified status (or full Level 3 certification) is required for all coaches representing Team Canada at the Summer and Winter World University Games.

Exemptions from Competition-Development qualifications are possible only in exceptional cases as determined by U SPORTS.

- a) An exemption will be considered only if a coach has obtained NCCP Competition-Development In-Training status (or full Level 2 certification).
- b) A coach may be granted a maximum of one exemption in his/her coaching career per sport.
- c) An exemption may be granted on the premise that the coach plans to advance to Competition-Development certification within two years.
- d) Exemption requested must be officially submitted to U SPORTS as least 60 days prior to the start of the World University Games, using this form.

#### **GAMES PARTICIPATION COSTS**

This event is completely self-funded and the estimated cost for each participant (i.e. athlete, coach, official) is outlined below.

#### **JUDGE AND REFEREE FEES**

Sport delegations competing in the following sports must participate in covering the cost of international judges or referees to attend the World University Games:

#### **REIMBURSMENT POLICY**

Partial Refund may be provided based on confirmation of withdrawal with reason received by U SPORTS no later than **December 11, 2022.** The amount will be at U SPORTS sole discretion pending costs already incurred by U SPORTS as of this date.
