Key Note Presentation – Building Healthy High-Performance Teams, Dr. Greg Wells
Lisette Johnson-Stapley (Chief Sport Officer, U SPORTS) opened the 2019 AGM by
welcoming all delegates and guests. Health and Performance Psychologist, Dr. Greg
Wells, conducted a research presentation on the building of healthy high-performance
teams.

2. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 9:13 AM EST. Annette Trimbee acted as Chair of the meeting. A quorum of the members of the Board was present, and the meeting was duly constituted for the transaction of business.

3. Adoption of the Agenda

There were no additions to the agenda.

ON MOTION MADE by Peter Baxter (Wilfrid Laurier University), seconded by Joey Sabo (Bishop's University), and unanimously carried **IT WAS RESOLVED THAT** the Agenda for the Annual Meeting held on June 6, 2019 be hereby approved in the form presented.

4. Official Welcome/Opening Remarks

U SPORTS Board Chair, Annette Trimbee paid tribute to the indigenous communities within the Markham, ON region, and acknowledged the use of their land to host the 2019 U SPORTS Annual Meeting and Conference. Dr. Trimbee applauded the continuous efforts being made by the collective membership, to further enhance the Canadian university sport system.





5. Moments of Recognition

Recognition was made to all departing staff members from the U SPORTS membership, Conference Offices, and other supporters of U SPORTS.

6. Approval of Last Minutes (June 2018)

ON MOTION MADE by Carol Hofer (Trinity Western University), seconded by Ken Schildroth (MacEwan University), and unanimously carried **IT WAS RESOLVED THAT** the minutes of the Annual Meeting held on June 6, 2019 are hereby approved.

7. Presentation of Audited Financial Statements

David Goldstein (Chief Operating Officer, U SPORTS) presented the audited financial statements of the Corporation for the fiscal period from April 1, 2018 to March 31, 2019.

A high-level overview of the Corporation's Sources of Revenue, the 2018/19 Statement of Operations, Statement of Financial Position, the 2018/19 Budget vs. Actuals, the 2019-20 approved (balanced) budget, and the current reserve position, was provided.

The cumulative deficit of \$208,598 (and this year's deficit of \$95,558) was lower than projected, earlier in the current fiscal. Although this is still not a reflection of where U SPORTS would like to be financially, it is positive to see that the office's mitigation strategies resulting in small reductions in the current deficit.

With respect to long-term planning, as it relates to the organization's budgeting, the Finance Committee and Board ultimately took the position that the risk of reducing expenses to create some surplus in the coming year, would risk comprising the objectives of the organization, at the outset of an ambitious strategic plan. The result was a more conservative budget (with some, but fewer, soft dollars on the revenue side), while still allowing the organization the chance to achieve stated objectives.

Looking ahead, the goal of the National Office will be to reduce the current deficit, with improved revenue generation in the second and third years of the 2019-24 Strategic Plan.

Members of the Finance Committee (Pierre Zundel (outgoing Chair), Jennifer Brenning, Pierre Arsenault, Katie Spriggs and Nancy Walker) were commended for their many contributions to the committee, over the course of the 2018-19 fiscal.

8. Appointment of Public Accountant

ON MOTION MADE by Gord Hopper (University of British Columbia), seconded by Jennifer Myers (York University), and unanimously carried **IT WAS RESOLVED THAT** KPMG be retained as the public accountant of the Corporation for the ensuing year.





9. The Napkin Exercise - Alberto Ruiz Luca de Tena, founder of Angles in Sport

Alberto Ruiz Luca conducted an exercise with the membership, focused on enhancing strategic planning and the successful execution of personal goals.

Graham Brown (President and Chief Executive Officer, U SPORTS) also noted that Alberto would be working with the National Office staff to operationalize departmental priorities, within the 2019-24 U SPORTS Strategic Plan.

10. Confirmation of Directors

11. By-Law Amendments

ON MOTION MADE by Deborah Bright-Brundle (Trent University), seconded by Roly Webster (University of Waterloo), and unanimously carried **IT WAS RESOLVED THAT** the articles and by-laws of the Corporation be amended to reflect the addition of a Vice-Chair as an Officer of U SPORTS, by adding a subsection (b) to by-law 3.3.1.1, and by adding a new by-law 3.3.3.2, as follows:

3.3.1.1 The Officers of U SPORTS shall be:

- a) Chair
- b) Vice-Chair
- c) Treasurer
- d) Secretary
- e) President and Chief Executive Officer (hereinafter referred to as Chief Executive Officer)
- 3.3.3.2 Vice-Chair
- a) The Vice-Chair shall provide ongoing support to the Chair.





- b) The Vice-Chair shall be available to act as a primary liaison between the Members and the Chief Executive Officer.
- c) The Vice-Chair shall be a member of the Human Resources Committee.
- d) The Vice-Chair shall perform all other duties as may from time to time be delegated by the Board of Directors.

12. Update from the Ad Hoc Medical Committee

Dr. Taryn Taylor discussed the recently instated U SPORTS Medical Committee, its current makeup, committee terms (i.e., three-year terms, with staggered start and end dates), meeting timelines (i.e., one in-person meeting, and six to eight conference calls, annually) and the overall roles and objectives of the committee. Dr. Taylor thanked Graham Brown for his support of the Medical Committee being developed.

Dr. Taylor encouraged the Conferences to remain engaged with this committee. She also noted the goal to have one representative from each Conference serve on the Medical Committee, to ensure effective consultation and engagement with the collective membership.

Projects undertaken by the Committee over the last two years:

- Comprehensive and Updated Medical Guidelines for National Championships;
- Concussion Statement and Educational Model (awareness, prevention, detection, management, and surveillance);
- Mental Health Best Practices:
- FISU Games documents and policies for the Medical Committee at the games;
- Application to disperse research studies / surveys (for research and review); and
- Injury Surveillance System (prevention strategies reliant on high-quality epidemiological data re. the incidence and severity of sports injuries).

Future Projects

- U SPORTS Medical Handbook;
- Standardized PPE document;
- Position statements on various health and safety topics; and
- Sport Medicine Symposium (to be held in association with a National event).

13. Presentation of Committee Reports

Committee Reports from the 2018-19 season were presented by the Chairs of the Sport; Athletic Financial Awards; Eligibility; and Equity Committees. Each committee Chair provided a high-level overview on the year's successes, challenges, and strategic priorities for the coming 2019-20 season.

14. Other Business

Recognition / Basecamp

Colleagues from Sport Canada were recognized for their many contributions over the last year, in supporting the continued growth of Canadian university sport. The consistent support provided by Pierre Thibault, was particularly highlighted. The importance of effective communication, transparency, and alignment across the Conference Offices, the collective membership, and U SPORTS was reiterated. The project management tool "Basecamp" was highlighted as a mechanism for enhancing group communication, and task management.

Awards and Recognition Portfolio

The U SPORTS Awards and Recognition portfolio was discussed, outlining program advancements and opportunities for improvement in the year ahead. In addition, hard copies of the program guidebook were distributed to the membership. Staff and membership colleagues contributing to the elevation of the program were thanked by the U SPORTS senior team.

Broadcast Strategy Update Presentation

A historical overview of the partnership with Sportsnet and TVA Sports was provided. It was confirmed that the partnership with Sportsnet and U SPORTS had ended, and would not be renewed. U SPORTS thanked Sportsnet for their loyalty and support to Canadian university sport, over the years.

A national university sport broadcast model was presented to the membership, as an opportunity for the future U SPORTS television strategy. The concept would incorporate a united approach to competition broadcasting. Key events across the four Conferences, and their respective sports would be presented. The membership was asked to confirm their level of support for such a strategy, before further work would be done by the U SPORTS Commercial team.

15. Adjournment of Meeting

ON MOTION MADE by Jean-Pierre Chancy (Université de Montréal), seconded by Wally Gabler (University of Guelph), and unanimously carried **IT WAS RESOLVED THAT** the annual meeting held on June 6, 2019, be hereby adjourned.
