- 3. Sport Committee reviewed the applications to the new U SPORTS Sport Model Program and made recommendations on the addition of the sport of Tennis in the 2023-2024 season and reclassification of Wrestling & Field Hockey to move to P2 by the 2024-2025 season
- 4. Made recommendation to approve the motion from the Men's Volleyball STSC to keep with current berth structure through to 2024-2025 season.
- 5. Reviewed recommendation by Hockey STSC to stay status quo on Berth structure and formats through to 2025-2026 season.
- 6. Reviewed dates Future National Championships (Update only-request from OUA and AUS offices)

 Successful U SPORTS Cross Country Championship hosted jointly by Dalhousie University and Saint Mary's University. McMaster University (Men's) captured their first U SPORTS national title since 1963 while Universite Laval won their second consecutive national title (Women's).

• Successful U SPORTS Track and Field Championship hosted by the University of Saskatchewan. University of Guelph swept the championship banners for the fifth straight time.

C. Field Hockey – Partnership Sport

Past Seasons Accomplishments:

 U SPORTS approved the Coaches Association to increase roster in playing regulations to align with the FIH (international sports body for field hockey) who changed the roster rule from 16 athletes to 18.

Priorities for the Sport of Field Hockey:

- Under the new sport model Field Hockey will move from a P1 (conference sanction) sport to P2 (invitational) sport beginning in 2024 – 2025. 2023 U SPORTS Championship will be hosted by the OUA.
- 2023-2024 will be the last year that a U SPORTS Coaches Committee for Field Hockey will exist (as per the new sport model).

D. Curling – Partnership Sport

- Operated under the flexible model by Curling Canada
- Curling Canada hosted the 2023 University Curling Championships at Laurentian University. This was the first championship since 2020 in the sport of Curling.
- U SPORTS is developing a new Partnership Agreement to align with the Sport Model
