IN CASE OF AN EMERGENCY





1. INTRODUCTION

In the event of a “disaster” (bomb, fire, earthquake, etc), Team Canada needs a plan of action for athletes and mission staff inside and out of the Athlete Village.

This document is intended to be used as a guide for the medical staff to evacuate the Medical Clinic and manage its patients in the event of a disaster and in conjunction with FISU Games Emergency Preparedness and Response Plan.

Please ensure that all members of the Health Services Team (HST) are familiar with the Canadian FISU Committee Emergency Response Plan.

2. DESIGNATED MEETING PLACE

In the event of an incident, all Canadian medical personnel should report to the area _____.

Note: The designated meeting place and assignment of care locations may be changed depending on the nature of the emergency situation and this will be determined by the CMO or designate(s) at the time of disaster.

3. EVACUATION

All HST staff in the Clinic at the time of the order, will assist in the safe evacuation of all staff/patients/athletes to the designated meeting place. All machines should be unplugged and doors closed and locked, if time permits. Any patients requiring assistance with wheelchairs/crutches should be accompanied by these aids.

The staff still in the Medical Clinic should grab full medical and therapy bags to ensure equipment is available for treatment.

- **The Chief Therapist** will ensure that the clinic is closed and ensure evacuation of all patients and staff.
- The Medical Team Leader is designated as the **Chief Medical Officer**.

4. TRIAGE & TREATMENT AREAS

All Triage of medical personnel will occur at the designated meeting place.

All Canadian personnel must stop and be triaged at this point. They will then be directed or brought to one of four **Treatment Areas**, which will include: Resuscitation, Acute Care, Minor Care and Holding Area. Equipment will be distributed from the Triage area.

The administration offices and _____ will be used as treatment areas, if they are safe.

Treatment Areas:

- a. **Resuscitation Treatment Area:** critical injuries, life or limb threatening. Equipment – all Clinic supplies.
- b. **Acute Care Treatment Area:** fractures, major lacerations... Equipment – 2 Medi-Sacs, 1 portable phone, suture sets, splints, bandages, saline, I.V.'s
- c. **Minor Care Treatment Area:** bruises, scrapes, psychological distress... Equipment - 2 Medi-Sacs, 1 portable phone, bandages, saline.
- d. **Holding Area/Triage:** no injuries. the clinic phone.

5. COMMUNICATION TREE

A call is considered completed only if you have spoken directly to a person and they have clearly understood the instructions.

The **Chief Medical Officer** is to call the **Chief Therapist** and _____.

6. OUTSIDE THE ATHLETE VILLAGE

The **CMO** will be the lead and will communicate directly with outside locations/hotels in case of an Emergency.

People staying outside the Village should follow the Hotel disaster plans. _____ must review the emergency plan and communicate with the HST leads if they have any concerns.

A medical disaster outside the Village will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis. The local authorities will be contacted and Athlete Village personnel/supplies will be deployed as the situation requires.
