Playing Regulations: Men's and Women's Swimming

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1. CHAMPIONSHIP ROSTER (Male and Female)
Each championship team shall consist of all individuals, from their most recently submitted CIS Eligibility Form, who have qualified for championship participation as per the standards articulated below. The limit for an institution's championship roster shall be eighteen (18) men and eighteen (18) women.

 - 3.3 INDIVIDUAL ELIGIBILITY
To be eligible to compete in the CIS Championship, a competitor must have posted a qualifying time while academically eligible and on the eligibility roster. Once qualified they may use any time from October 1 of the current season for ranking and entry. Competing in a Sport Conference championship is not a pre-requisite unless stipulated by the Sport Conference.
 - 3.4 INDIVIDUAL ENTRIES
 - 3.4.1 Each competitor may pre-enter a maximum of six individual events.
Note: At least one of the pre-entered events must be an event in which the qualifying standard has been achieved, however, it need not be one of the events in which the athlete competes.
 - 3.4.2 Each competitor may only compete in a maximum of four (4) individual events.
 - 3.4.3 The total number of all events competed by an individual, including relays, shall be a maximum of 7 events.
 - 3.5 INDIVIDUAL RANKINGS
For ranking of individual swimmers, each university must submit results to the designated ranking system.
 - 3.6 TEAM ENTRIES
There is no limit on the number of swimmers from one school that may enter an event at the championship. Each institution is permitted one relay team entry per relay event. Relay complement names must be submitted a minimum of 30 minutes before the team is to swim.

Entry times for all events must be met during the current interuniversity competitive season, between October 1st of the current season to the later of the Sports Conference championship or on the Monday prior to the date of the CIS championship prior to 12:00 noon Pacific time, in competition acceptable for qualifications to CIS championships and/or Sport Conference meet.



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Seeding will be done based on short course metres—including the 1500m freestyle. That is, any LCM times will be converted to scm for seeding

3.6.1 ENTRIES FOR TIME FINAL EVENTS

1. Relay entries must be submitted with an entry time that has been posted on the designated rankings system. Relays can enter with a different time if it can be proven to meet management by the start of the Technical Meeting.
2. Proof of time is required for all timed final events. Relay entry times shall be from current season ranked times (as of October 1st) on the designated ranking system, unless faster proven times are submitted to meet management by the start of the CIS Championship Technical Meeting. Individual event challenged proof of time procedures will follow the SNC relay proof of time procedure. Times, which cannot be proven, will be entered as no time. The relay time belongs to the institution (school). On-site proven times are cumulative times and must include athletes who are entered and in attendance at the meet and have swam these times within the qualifying time period. At no time will unproven times be entered. All entry times are according to the event distance.

3.6.2 RELAY QUALIFICATION

1. A team can enter a relay if they have four or more swimmers of one sex (at the championships) that have qualified as per 3.3.
2. An institution may enter a relay team if they have only three individuals (of one sex) that meet the individual event qualification requirement. The institution may then add one swimmer (of that sex) to the CIS team (not one swimmer per relay team) that can swim only relays. The addition is at the expense of the athlete's institution, on the understanding that the institution has no obligation to make this addition and the swimmer is not included in the CIS travel pool. Such a swimmer must be declared at the technical meeting prior to the beginning of the meet.
3. A team can enter a relay team if they have a posted relay time (on SNC ranking site) that equals or betters the CIS relay qualifying time.

Note: Such a relay can include swimmers that have not met any additional CIS event qualifying times. Such a swimmer would not be eligible to swim in any individual events at the CIS Championship and would attend solely at the institution's expense and would not be included in the CIS travel pool. This swimmer must have been a member of the relay team that posted the qualifying time (meet results may need to be presented at the Technical meeting as names are not included for relay teams on the Sporting Canada website).

3.6.3 SPORT CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Each Sport Conference shall determine the most appropriate date, place and format for hosting their Sport Conference championship. Notification must be sent to the CIS



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Office by September 1 of the year in question as to the date of the championship in that year.

3.6.4 DUAL AND SNC SANCTIONED COMPETITIONS

A dual meet is defined as a competition between:

1. Two or more CIS member institutions.
2. A CIS member institution and a SNC registered club.
3. A CIS member institution and one or more American universities; in which the competition:
 - * Has been publicized in advance.
 - * Utilizes qualified officials.
 - * Is the only method of achieving qualifying times (i.e. no time trials).
 - * Results are forwarded to the secretary or designate for ranking purposes.

3.6.5 TIME TRIALS

Sanctioned time trial results are acceptable for rankings and for meet qualifications.

3.7 TEAM RANKINGS

Results will be posted regularly on the SNC site. Point scores will be based on the same scoring system used at the CIS Championships. (4.10.1)

4. COMPETITION

4.1 CHAMPIONSHIP FORMAT

The CIS Championship, for both men and women, shall take place at the same location over the same three (3) day format. This championship meet shall be run with short course (25m) heats and finals.

4.4 PROCEDURES AND PROTESTS

4.4.1 ENTRY DEADLINE

Entries must be sent prior to 12 noon pacific time on the Monday prior to the start of the CIS Championship.

4.4.2 ENTRY GRIDS

The current year of eligibility of each swimmer must be included with the HYTek/Splash files and subsequently included on the entry sheets, preliminary heats sheets, and final sheets.

4.4.3 CHANGES TO ENTRIES



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Changes to entries are permitted after the entry deadline, and up to the start of the CIS Championship Technical meeting, providing a \$50.00 administrative fee per change is paid to the Host Organizing Committee and the entry is declared at the CIS Championship Technical meeting (for example: person "A" out of the 50m free into the 100m free is considered one change).

4.4.4 SCRATCH PROCEDURES

To withdraw swimmers from 'extra' events, scratch cards for each day's events will be placed in a scratch box by the scratch deadline the evening preceding each competition day as per this schedule:

1. For events 1 - 12: The conclusion of the CIS Championship Technical Meeting.
2. For events 13 - 24: 30 minutes after the conclusion of the finals session on the first day.
3. For events 25 - 32: 30 minutes after the conclusion of the finals session on the second day.

Scratch for finals shall be made 30 minutes after the conclusion of heats.

NOTE: There will be no additional penalties in the CIS Championships beyond missing the event.

The 800m Free, 1500m Free, 400m Free Relay, 800m Free Relay, and 400 Medley Relay shall be swum as timed finals.

The 800m Free and the 1500m Free, except for the fastest seeded heats of each event, which will swim during the evening final, are to be swum slowest to fastest alternating women and men in a separate session, in the long course pool set up, prior to the start of the final session warm-ups. A time line will be posted once all scratches are submitted and the fastest heat shall end one (1) hour prior to the start of the Final Session

The consolation final shall precede the championship final in each event in the final session.

4.6 GAME TIMES (N/A)

4.7 PRACTICE TIMES / WARM-UPS

As a minimum practice times should be made available two days prior to the start of the championship from 4:00 – 7:00 p.m. then on the day prior to the competition from 9:00 a.m. to noon and 4:00 – 7:00 p.m. Preferred pool set up is 2 X 25 meters in morning session and 1 X 50m in the afternoon session when LC finals are scheduled and 2 X 25 meters for all sessions when not. Set up should include lane ropes, backstroke flags, a minimum of two touch pads, two starting blocks in the pool and a backstroke ledge. Additional practice times may be offered and appreciated by the competitors. These times are to be communicated through the information bulletins.

8:00 – 9:50 a.m. warm up (both tanks); 9:50 warm up ends in competition end; 10:00 a.m. start of preliminary session – warm up tank stays available until 30 minutes after end of preliminary session (traditionally 1 p.m. at latest); 4:00 – 5:45 p.m. warm up in competition pool; 5:45 competition pool is cleared and warm up facility remains available until 30 minutes after end of competition. Warm up pool will have appropriate set up with flags and lane ropes to provide a safe environment for the swimmers. On the day 3 the distance events will begin earlier in the afternoon – pool will be available for warm up 1 hour prior to the start of the distance session (approximately 2 p.m.). This time will be published by the host committee during Day 1 of the competition.

4.10 SCORING AND STANDARDS

4.10.1 SCORING

1. Individual Events:

Shall be scored to sixteen (16) places when using an 8 lane pool - 20, 17, 16, 15, 14, 13, 12, 11 (championship final); 9, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 (consolation final).

Shall be scored to twenty (20) places when using a 10 lane pool – 24, 21, 20, 19, 18, 17, 16, 15, 14, 13 (championship final) 11, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 (consolation final).

2. Relay Events:

Shall be scored double individual event scores.

4.10.2 STANDARDS

Qualifying standards are arrived at by taking the average time from the past five years of the 16th place time in the heats per event of the CIS Championship. An individual must meet or exceed the current time standards during the competitive season outlined in 4.10.2.2.

Qualifying standards for relays is based on the average time of the 8th place finish from the past five CIS Championships.

Time standards as submitted by the Coaches Technical Committee and approved by the CIS Sport Committee, shall be circulated annually to all Coaches and Athletic Directors by October 1st.

1. Standards – Conversion

2. For qualification purposes all short course yards and long course meter qualifying standards shall be arrived at by using the current HyTek meet manager default factor as of March 1st. No conversions will be accepted for qualification. For seeding purposes all times will be converted by the meet management using the current HyTek meet manager default factor. All entries and proof of times must be provided to meet management in the course they were achieved in. Coaches will not convert entry times.

2. Individual Qualifying Standards

Standards must be met during the current interuniversity competitive season, between October 1st of the current season to the later of the Sport Conference championship meet or on the Monday prior to the start date of the CIS Championship, in competition acceptable for qualifications to CIS Championships and/or Sport Conference meet.



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4.11 RECORDS AND STATISTICS

4.11.1 Rules

The performance for which a record is claimed must be made in a race that is a regular part of the championship meet. Record times shall be recognized for performances by the contestant who swims the first leg of a relay race, which is a regular part of the meet. Timers shall be directed to time the latter and record the time accurately on the provided cards.

4.11.2 Publication

Record performances shall be noted automatically as an integral part of the meet recording procedures. It shall be the duty of the CIS Technical Secretary to publish a current list of records as an appendix to the playing regulations.

5.9.1 All sessions shall be conducted in an eight **or ten** lane facility, with warm up facilities available throughout the CIS Championship meet.

5.9.2 The entry file will be available on the SNC meet site in January.

5.9.3 Psyche sheets (master entry sheets)

Shall be posted on the CIS Host website and emailed to all participating schools by the Tuesday prior to the championship.

5.9.4 Heat sheets for time final events:

Shall be posted thirty minutes after the scratch deadline.



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6. RULES

CIS rules shall govern the CIS Swimming Championship as outlined in the regulations, however, general conduct of the CIS Swimming Championship shall be governed by the latest edition of the Swimming Canada (SNC) handbook. Exceptions are listed in the regulations.

Time final events with 9 or 10 entrants for an 8 lane pool or 11 or 12 entrants for a 10 lane pool, or 17 or 18 entrants for an 8 lane pool or 21 or 22 entrants in a 10 lane pool, will be swum with one or two full heats respectively leaving the remaining heats with only one or two teams respectively to swim.

SWIM CANADA AFFILIATION

In order for ALL CIS events to receive a sanction from Swim Canada, all CIS member institutions must pay their affiliation fee.

As per SNC rules, all coaches must maintain CSCTA registration for deck access at any sanctioned competition.

9.1 CHAMPIONSHIP TROPHY (MEN-NELSON C. HART TROPHY) AND CIS PENNANT

Presented to the CIS Men's Championship Team and the CIS Women's Championship Team.



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- 9.2 CHAMPIONSHIP MEDALS (Male and Female)
- 9.2.1 Gold medals are awarded to CIS Championship Team (18 total).
 - 9.2.2 Gold, silver and bronze are awarded to each individual in an event (individual and/or relay).
- 9.3 ALL-CANADIANS (Male and Female)
- 9.3.1 The gold medalist in the men and women's events (including relays) at the CIS National Championship will make up the 1st Team All-Canadians.
 - 9.3.2 The silver medalist in the men and women's events (including relays) at the CIS National Championship will make up the 2nd Team All-Canadians.
Note: Alternates that competed are also listed as All-Canadians.
- 9.4 OUTSTANDING SWIMMERS OF THE YEAR (Male and Female)
- 9.4.1 Based solely on performance at the championship.
 - 9.4.2 Criteria for selection: gold medalist in an event; and the swimmer with the highest aggregate point total for his/her two best swims as based on Swim Canada's performance charts.
- 9.5 ROOKIE OF THE YEAR (Male and Female)
- 9.5.1 Based solely on the performance at the Championship.
 - 9.5.2 Criteria for selection: First year of CIS eligibility, 21 years of age or younger as of September 1st in the current academic year, and the swimmer with the highest aggregate point total for his/her two best swims as based on FINA performance charts.
- 9.6 STUDENT-ATHLETE COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD (Male and Female)
- 9.6.1 Selected by the coaches.
 - 9.6.2 Recipients who demonstrate outstanding achievements in three (3) areas: swimming, academics and community involvement.
 - 9.6.3 To win the national award the athlete must have won the award in their Regional Association.
 - 9.6.4 An electronic nomination form must be submitted to the CIS Swimming President. This submission is due at the same time as the CIS championship entry deadline.
 - 9.6.5 At the CIS Championships the CIS Coaches will form a sub-committee consisting of one coach from each swimming conference and the CIS Swimming Representative. This committee will read each nomination form, discuss nominations, and vote to determine the winner.
 - 9.6.6 Criteria: The student-athlete must be on the school roster. The athlete does not need to be a CIS Championship qualifier, but is strongly encouraged to have competed at the Conference championships and be diligently training. (Examples of Community Involvement: volunteering, coaching, team leadership, special community event coordination.)
- 9.7 CHAMPIONSHIP MVP (SPRINTER'S CUP) (Male and Female)



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Awarded to the male and female who win both the 50m and 100m freestyle events. If the swimmer does not win both the 50m and 100m the award is not presented. The winner will be announced and awarded at the conclusion of the medals for the 100m freestyle.

9.8 COACH OF THE YEAR (Male and Female)

Each school with a swimmer in the meet shall have one vote. The ballots will be handed out with the final sheets on the evening of Day Three. The ballots must be returned/collected by the finish of the Men's 1500m Freestyle. The ballots should include:

- 9.8.1 Two columns – titled: Men's Team – Coach of the Year; Women's Team – Coach of the Year.
- 9.8.2 Each team, with coach, is listed under each heading in alphabetical order.
- 9.8.3 The team point standings after the end of Day Two of the current meet will be listed at the bottom of the sheet.
- 9.8.4 The team point standings at the conclusion of the previous years CIS Championship shall be listed at the bottom of the sheet.
- 9.8.5 The top three individual swims (of each gender) after Day Two shall be listed.

9.9 GRAND SLAM AND SUPER GRAND SLAM AWARD

- 9.9.1 Grand Slam Award – awarded to any swimmer who wins the same individual event 4 times in their CIS career.
- 9.9.2 Super Grand Slam Award – awarded to any swimmer who wins the same individual event 5 times in their CIS career.

Note: Recognition with presentation of unique print commissioned by Doug Perks of Team Aquatic Supplies to recognize.

10. COMMITTEES

10.1 CHAMPIONSHIP MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

The Management Committee shall rule on all matters necessary for the championship to proceed and will, in addition, act as the Protest Committee at the championship. The Management Committee shall apply CIS Rules. The Management Committee may not, nor may any member, make an exception to any CIS Rule or to a sanction imposed by CIS. The Management Committee has no jurisdiction to consider or interpret CIS Eligibility Regulations.

Composition of the Management Committee shall be:

- 1. Convener of Championship - non-voting chair.
- 2. CIS Delegate.
- 3. Technical Delegate.
- 4. President of the Coaches Executive, or designate.

A quorum shall require all four members, or their replacement.



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If a member of the Management Committee was involved, directly or indirectly, in a decision or an interpretation of a CIS Rule that is being appealed/protested to the Management Committee that member shall be excused from the Management Committee. In this event, the remaining members of the Management Committee have the authority to appoint as a replacement for the excused member an individual who is independent, unbiased and uninvolved in the matter in dispute. The decision regarding whether a member of the Management Committee should be excused and replaced lies solely with the Management Committee.

Notwithstanding the procedures described in CIS policy 90.70.4.1.1 (see below), the CIS Championship Management Committee shall have the power and jurisdiction to take interim on-the-spot measures to address minor code of conduct issues (inappropriate or unsportsmanlike conduct that is not criminal in nature) that arise at CIS Championships, in a timely fashion. The record of the incident, including the interim measures taken to address it shall be copied to the Athletic Director(s) of the affected school(s), and the CIS office and Discipline Committee.

It is the expectation of CIS that persons representing Member institutions, and/or CIS, at CIS Championships will behave responsibly, and with propriety, and in accordance with the laws of the land.

90.70.4.1.1 Procedures Regarding Misconduct

Where misconduct occurs at a CIS Championship (including traveling to and from the event, practice days and competition days), the Chief Executive Officer, assisted by the event Convener, shall:

1. Investigate the particulars of the incident that gave rise to the misconduct.
2. Determine the amount and type of damage to property or injury to persons.
3. Identify the persons and institutions responsible for the incident; and
4. Summarize this information in a written report.

The Chief Executive Officer shall provide a copy of the written report to the President, who may bring a complaint in accordance with CIS Policy 90.40 - Discipline. A copy of the written report shall be provided to the Directors of Athletics of the institutions involved.

10.2 JURY OF APPEAL

10.2.1 SWIMMING JURY OF APPEAL

Clarification of rulings shall be governed by SNC regulations with reference to protests and swimming jury of appeal. Swimming jury of appeal is the responsibility of the Meet Manager. (Reference section E.9)

10.2.2 CIS JURY OF APPEAL



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If a coach is not satisfied with the decision made by the Swimming Jury, he/she can appeal to the CIS Jury of Appeal as outlined in the paragraph below. To lodge an appeal, the coach must submit the protest in writing to the CIS Jury of Appeal. A \$50.00 protest fee, refundable only when an appeal is supported, must accompany the protest; otherwise the fee remains with the Host.

The CIS Jury of Appeal shall be appointed at the Technical Coaches Meeting prior to the start of the CIS Championship meet, and shall have the authority to act in any situation not specifically covered by the rules and regulations. The Jury shall consist of: Meet Convener, Meet Referee, CIS Delegate and two coaches. (Three coaches, one acting as an alternate in case of conflict of interest in the appeal, are elected at the Technical Coaches meeting).
